

PTZ Control Center Operations Manual

Introduction

PTZ Control Center is an application software that runs on Windows.

By running this software on a Windows PC, you can remotely operate the Panasonic cameras present on the local network in a very easy manner.

In addition, Panasonic cameras at a remote location can be operated remotely by linking to the KAIROS Cloud Platform.

Main features

Following are the main features of this software.

1. It allows remote operation of PTZ cameras

You can perform the following operations on Panasonic PTZ cameras.

- Pan/Tilt the camera by clicking/touching the screen
By clicking/touching the camera screen that is displayed, you can directly specify the movement position of the camera and perform Pan/Tilt operations.
- Pan/Tilt/Zoom the camera with range specification on screen
Specify an area on the camera screen displayed to Pan/Tilt/Zoom so that the specified area is displayed in a full screen.
- Pan/Tilt/Zoom the camera with buttons/slider
You can use the buttons/slider GUI of the software to perform Pan/Tilt/Zoom operations of the camera.
- Pan/Tilt/Zoom the camera using a keyboard/game controller
You can Pan/Tilt/Zoom the camera from a keyboard or game controller connected to the PC.
- Register/Call/Delete a preset for the camera
You can register, call, and delete the Pan/Tilt/Zoom position preset of the camera.
- Image quality adjustment of the camera
You can adjust Focus/Iris/Gain/WB/Shutter/ND Filter of the camera.
- Start/Stop SD card recording of the camera
You can Start/Stop recording of a camera that has the SD card recording function.

2. You can simultaneously operate multiple PTZ cameras

You can simultaneously perform the following operations on multiple Panasonic PTZ cameras.

- Pan/Tilt/Zoom the camera with buttons/slider
- Call a preset for the camera
- Image quality adjustment of the camera (Focus, Iris only)

3. Multiple camera types are supported

The following three camera types are supported.

- PTZ camera + SUB Camera

Image of the PTZ camera is displayed on the top screen and image of the control assist camera AW-HEA10 or AW-UE4 is displayed on the bottom screen, and PTZ operation is performed.

- PTZ camera + Panorama still image

Image of PTZ camera is displayed on the top screen and panorama still image considering the usage environment is displayed on the bottom screen, and PTZ operation is performed.

You can create the panorama still image by using the PTZ camera.

- Standalone PTZ camera

You can display the image of PTZ camera only and perform PTZ operation.

4. Display of H.264 streaming images from camera

You can have full screen display of H.264 streaming images from the PTZ camera.

5. It allows quality adjustment of the Camcoders

You can adjust the quality of Panasonic Camcoders.

6. It allows network setting of cameras

You can automatically detect the cameras present on the network and perform network settings.

7. It allows function restrictions by each user

You can set function restrictions such as the cameras that can be accessed are restricted by each user.

8. It allows migration of setting data

You can copy the setting data of this software between multiple PCs.

9. Support for touch panel operation

This software supports touch panel based operation. You can perform operations described with “click” in this manual as touch operations.

10. It includes the EasyIP Setup Tool Plus application

This software includes the EasyIP Setup Tool Plus application for easy PTZ camera setup and updates.

11. It allows camera SDI output image display using the SDI to UVC converter (paid option)

You can display SDI output image from the camera by using a commercially available SDI to UVC converter.

12. It provides a GUI that allows you to easily call presets for multiple cameras at the same time (paid option)

It provides a GUI that allows you to easily call presets for multiple cameras at the same time.

You can assign presets for multiple cameras by placing the preset call icon anywhere on the screen.

13. Cameras at a remote location can be operated by linking to the KAIROS Cloud Platform

Cameras at a remote location can be operated like a camera on the local network by linking to the KAIROS Cloud Platform.

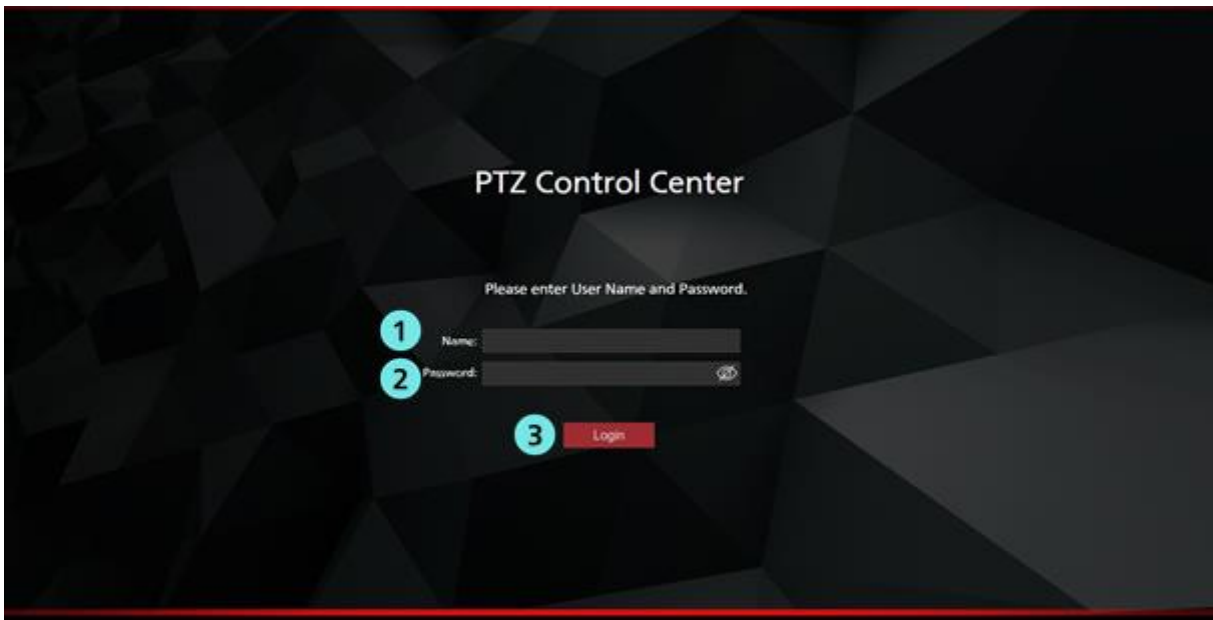
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Description of screens

Login screen

The following login screen appears after starting this software.



①User ID

Enter the user ID for logging on to this software.

②Password

Enter the password of the user.

③Login button

Login to the software with the user name and the password you entered.

<Note>

- For initial user name and password, and user account registration, please refer to "Administrator Settings" in the installation procedures manual.

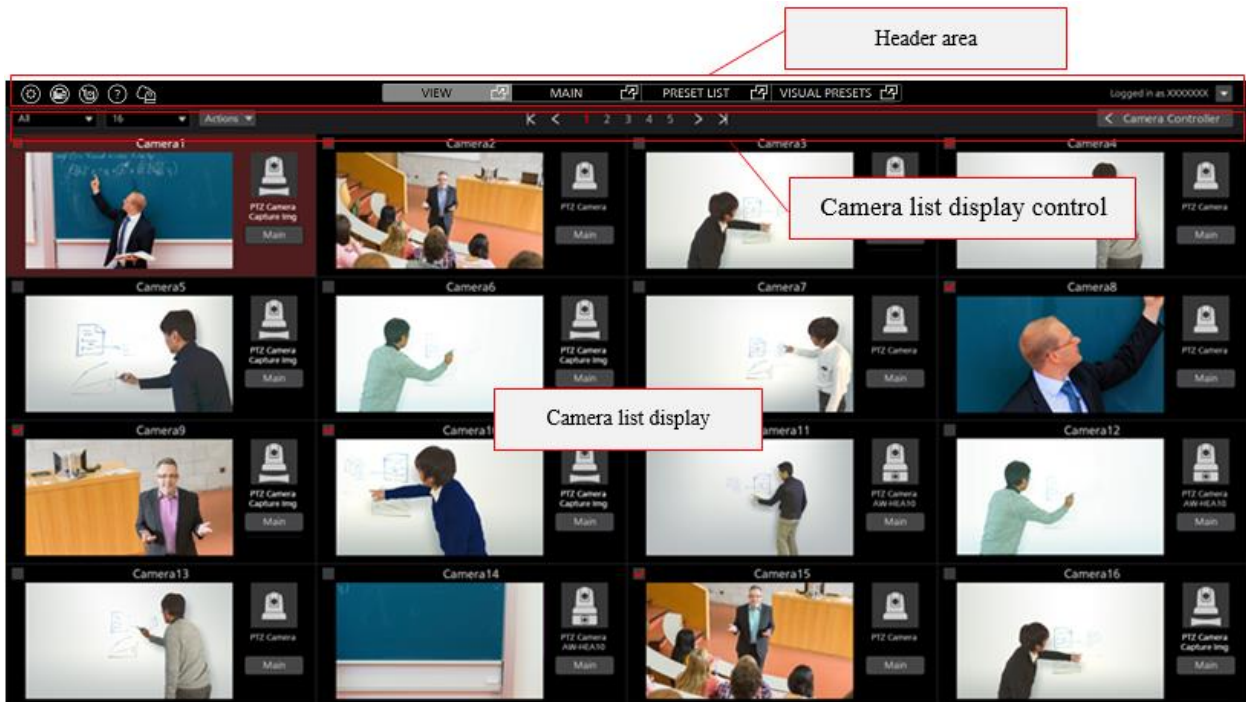
View screen

The following View screen appears after logging on the software.

On the View screen, list of the registered cameras will appear with information such as thumbnail.

The View screen is made of the following four areas.

- Header area
- Camera list display control part/Camera list display
- Camera controller (when display is ON)



View screen (Camera controller display OFF)



View screen (Camera controller display ON)

• **Header area**

The top part of the screen remains common for each screen.



① **Settings button**

It changes the display to the Settings screen.

② **AW-RP150 cooperation button**

It changes the display to the AW-RP150 control screen.

③ **EasyIP Setup Tool Plus application launch button**

It launches the EasyIP Setup Tool Plus application included with this software.

④ **Help button**

It shows the help file (this document) in a separate tab of the web browser.

⑤ **Cloud button**

Moves to the KAIROS Cloud Platform linkage screen.

⑥ **Screen switching tab**

It switches the View / Main / Preset List / Visual Presets screen.

The switching tab on the Visual Presets screen is displayed only when the paid option AW-SF300 is enabled.

⑦ **Camera controller display switchover button**

It switches the display type of the camera controller.

⑧ **Logout/Version menu**

Clicking ▼ will display the following menu.

Logout: You will logout from the software and the display will return to the Login screen.

Version: It will display the version information of the software.

• **Camera list top part**

In the top part of the camera list display, there are various buttons including the button for switching the list display.



① **Display refine list**

With the drop-down list, you can refine the cameras to be displayed.

You can refine the list with the following conditions.

All: Display all cameras

PTZ+SUB: It will display only those cameras where the Camera Type is [PTZ Camera + SUB Camera]

OTHER: It will display only those cameras where the Camera Type is [PTZ Camera + Image] or [PTZ Camera]

Check: It will display only those cameras where the check field in the camera list display is ON

Cloud: Displays only cameras that are to be controlled with KAIROS Cloud linkage

[Category name]: It will display only those cameras that belong to the categories registered in Category of the Settings screen

② Display count switchover list

With the drop-down list, you can change the number of cameras displayed per page.

③ Check status switchover list

With the drop-down list, you can turn ON/OFF the check status of all cameras that are displayed.

④ Page switchover button

It switches the camera list display page.

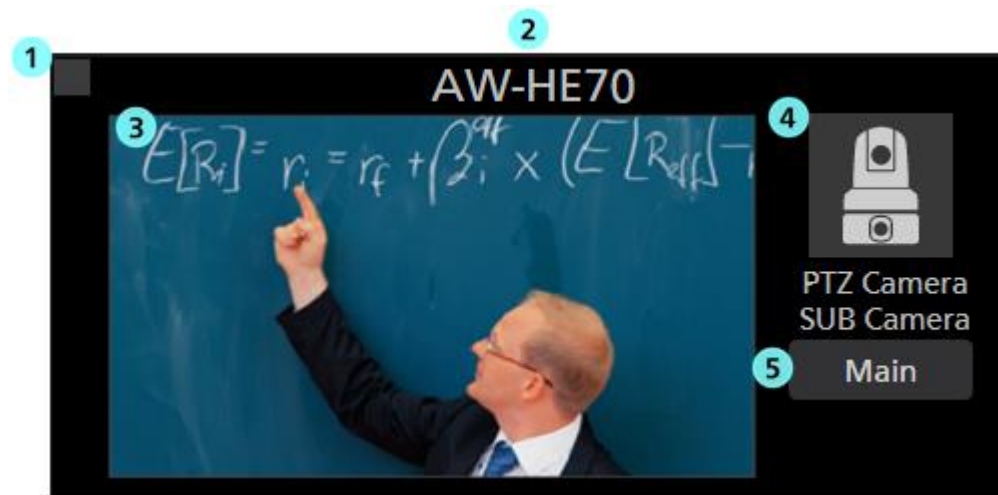
⑤ Camera controller show/hide switchover button

You can switch between show/hide the camera controller.

• Camera list display

It shows the display details of each camera in the camera list display.

Background of the cameras that are selected will appear in red color.



① Camera check field

Clicking this will switch the check status between ON/OFF.

You can perform the following operations on the cameras whose check status is ON.

- Cameras to be displayed when [Check] is selected in refining the camera list display
- Cameras to be operated when [Checked Multiple Camera] is selected on the Main screen

② Camera name display

It shows the name of the registered camera.

③ Thumbnail image display

It shows thumbnail image of the camera image.

When no camera is found (power supply is switched off, not connected to the network etc.), it will appear as "OFF."

④ Icon and name display of Camera Type

It shows the set Camera Type in the form of icon and type name.



If the camera is to be controlled with KAIROS Cloud linkage,  icon with cloud mark will be displayed.

⑤ **Main screen display button**

The display will change to the Main screen.

• **Camera controller**

It provides various operation functions of cameras.

For the details of operation method, refer to "Camera operation - Camera controller" in this document.

Main screen

Clicking the Main tab in the top part of the screen will display the Main screen.

The Main screen is made of the following three areas.

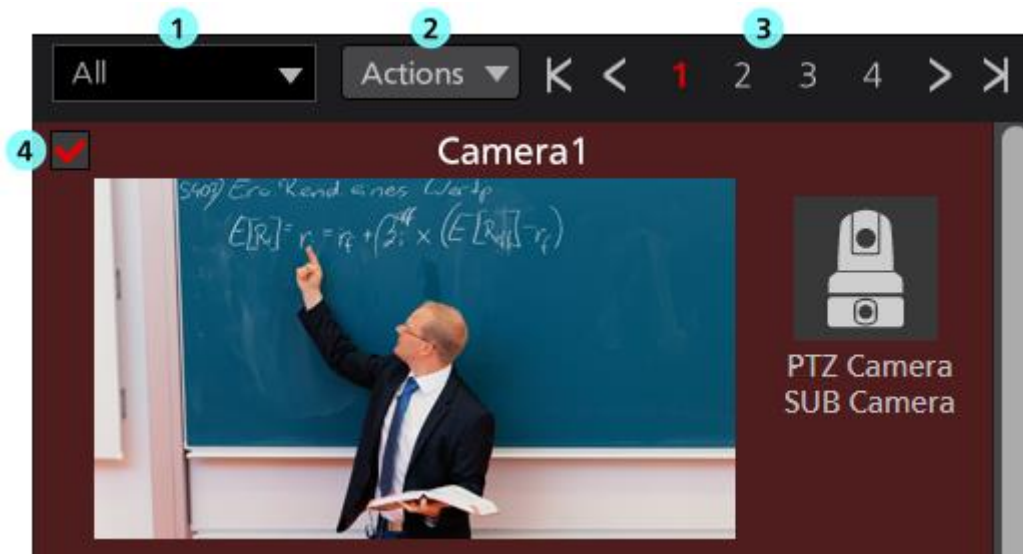
- Camera list display
- Camera image display area
- Camera controller



Main screen

- **Camera list display**

In the camera list display of the Main screen, each camera is arranged and placed vertically.



① Display refine list of the camera list

With the drop-down list, you can refine the cameras to be displayed.

Its function is same as that of the View screen.

② Check status switchover list

From the drop down list, you can turn ON/OFF the check status of all cameras that are displayed.

③ Page switchover button

It switches the camera list display page.

④ Camera list display

It shows the status of each camera.

It is same as that in the View screen except that the Main button is not there.

• Camera image display area

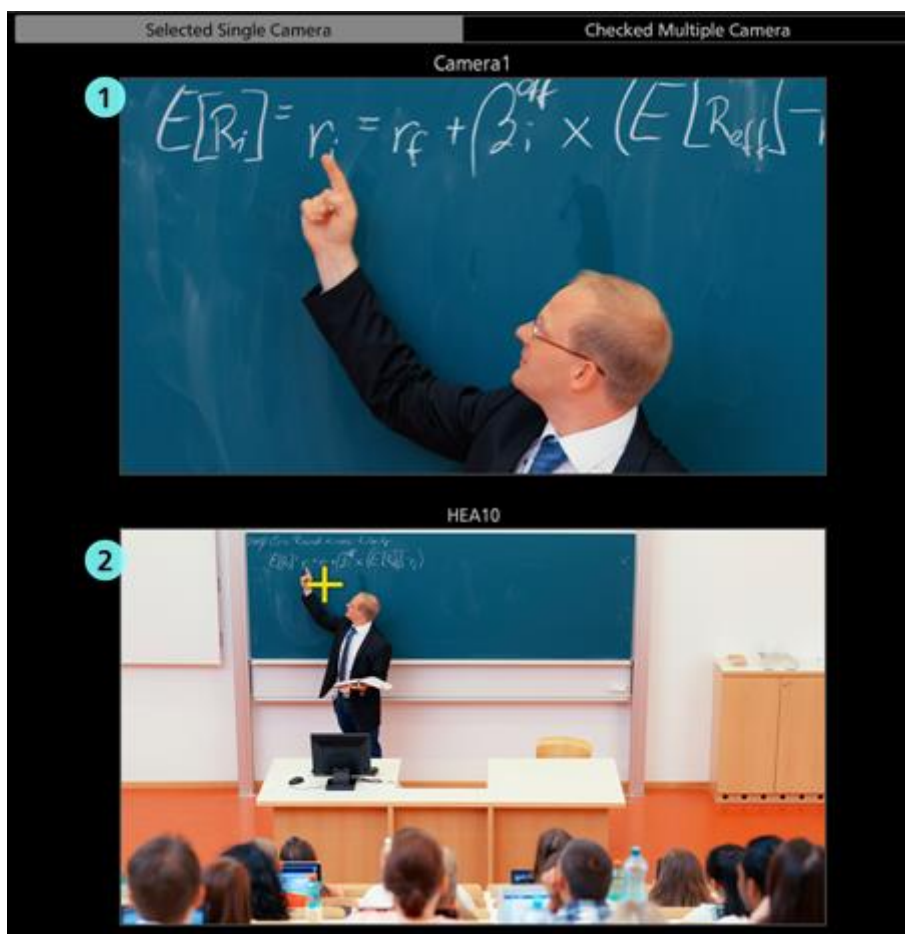
Image of the camera subject to operation is displayed in this area.

With the camera operation mode selection tab located at the top part, you can select whether to operate only one camera or multiple cameras simultaneously.

When [Selected Single Camera] is selected: Only one selected camera will be operated.

When [Checked Multiple Camera] is selected: All cameras whose check status is ON will be operated.

• Screen when [Selected Single Camera] is selected



①Top screen (PTZ camera image display)

Image of the PTZ camera selected in the camera list display will appear.

Clicking on the camera image will move the PTZ camera such that the clicked position comes at the center of the image.

②Bottom screen (sub-camera image/still image display)

Details that are displayed would differ depending on the Camera Type.

[PTZ Camera + SUB Camera]: Image of the control assist camera AW-HEA10 or AW-UE4 specified on the camera settings screen will appear.

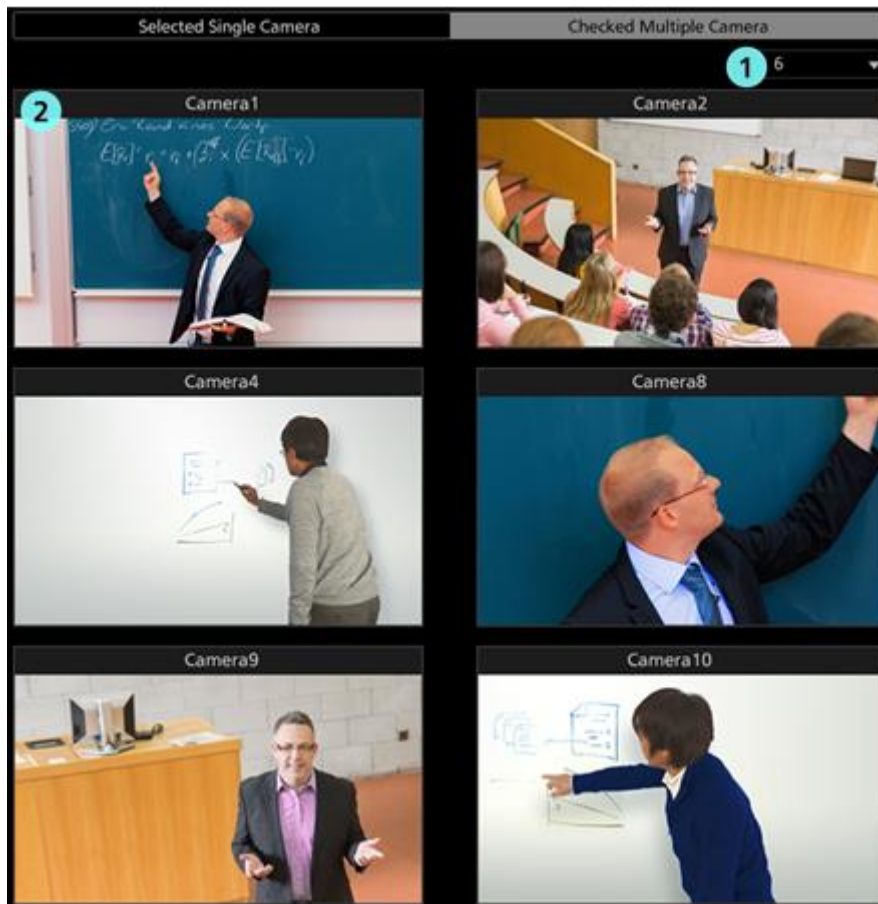
[PTZ Camera + Image]: Panorama still image specified on the camera settings screen will appear.

[PTZ Camera]: The display of bottom screen will not appear.

When the Camera Type is [PTZ Camera + SUB Camera] or [PTZ Camera + Image],

clicking on the image/still image will move the PTZ camera such that the clicked position comes at the center of the image.

• Screen when [Checked Multiple Camera] is selected



① Camera image count switchover list

With the drop-down list, you can switch the number of camera image to be displayed on one screen.

② Camera image

Image of the cameras whose check status is ON will appear.

• Camera controller

Its function is same as that of the View screen.

Preset List screen

Clicking on the PRESET LIST tab at the top of the screen will display the Preset List screen.

For the details of operation method, refer to “Using the Preset List screen” in this document.

Visual Presets screen

When the paid option AW-SF300 is enabled, the VISUAL PRESETS tab is displayed at the top of the screen.

Clicking on the VISUAL PRESETS tab will display the Visual Presets screen.

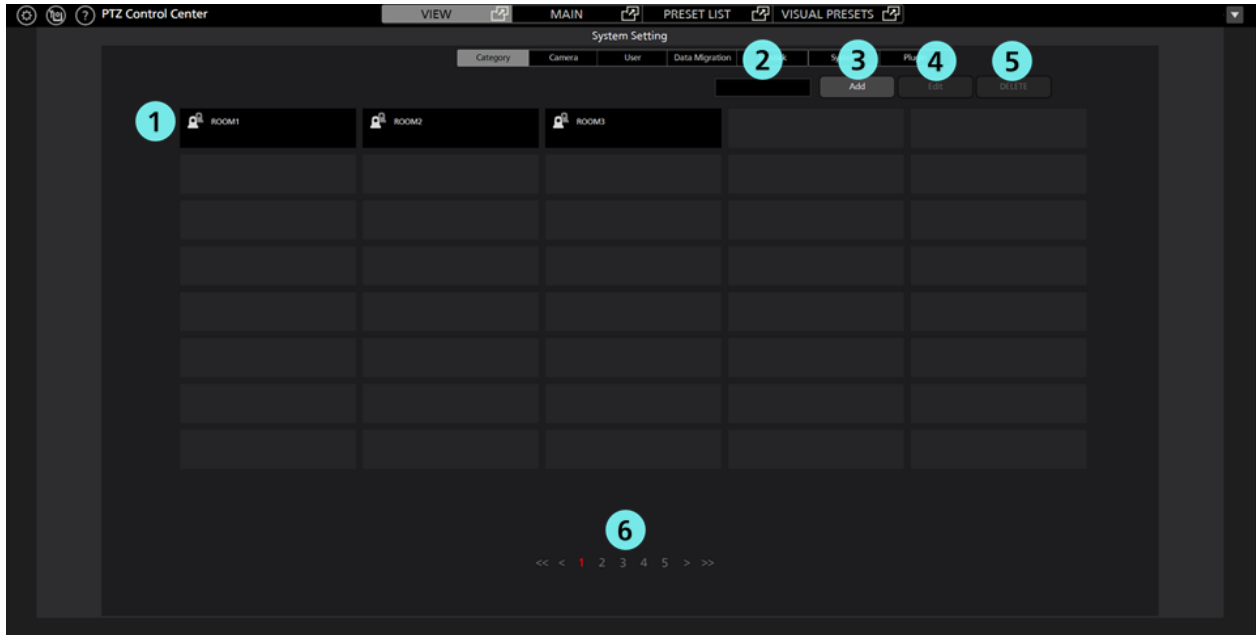
For details on how to use it, refer to “Paid optional features” → “Visual preset call feature” in this document.

Settings – Category screen

This screen is for the category (group) settings of the cameras that are registered.

Clicking the Settings button located at the top left of the screen and selecting the Category tab at the center of the screen will change the display to this screen.

For the details of category settings, refer to "Default Settings 2 - Category Settings of Camera" in this document.



①Category list display

It shows the list of registered categories.

②Search box

It is used when searching categories.

Entering a string will show the list of only those categories where the string is included in the name.

For going back to the original display, clear the string that you entered.

③Add button

The display will change to the Register Category screen.

④Edit button

The display will change to the Edit Category screen.

⑤Delete button

It will delete the selected categories.

⑥Page switchover button

You can switchover to the page you want to see.

Settings – Camera screen

This screen is for registering and setting the cameras to be used with the software.

Clicking the Settings button located at the top left of the screen and selecting the Camera tab at the center of the screen will change the display to this screen.

For the details of camera settings, refer to "Default Settings 1 (Camera Settings)" in this document.



①Name

It shows the name of the registered camera.

②IP Address

It shows the IP address of each camera.

③Port No.

It shows the port number to be used by each camera for communication.

④Now Connecting

The • sign will appear against the cameras that are in the process of connecting.

⑤Search box

It is used when searching the cameras with name.

Entering a string will show the list of only those cameras where the string is included in the name.

For going back to the original display, clear the string that you entered.

⑥Add button

The display will change to the Register Camera screen.

⑦Edit button

The display will change to the Edit Camera screen.

⑧Delete button

It will delete the selected camera.

⑨Page switchover buttons

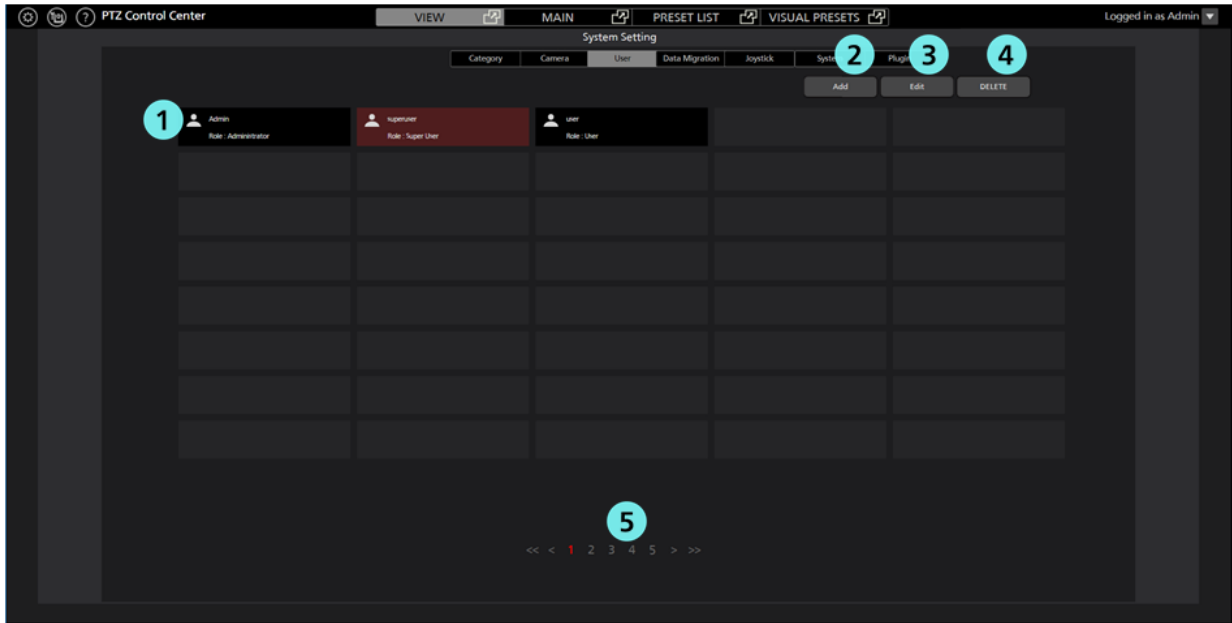
You can switchover to the page you want to see.

Settings – User screen

This screen is for setting accounts of the users who would use the software.

Clicking the Settings button located at the top left of the screen and selecting the User tab at the center of the screen will change the display to this screen.

For the details of account settings, refer to "Default Settings 2 - User Account Settings" in this document.



①Account list display

It shows the list of accounts registered in the software.

Account name will appear in the upper half of each account, while privilege will appear in the lower half.

②Add button

The display will change to the Register Account screen.

③Edit button

The display will change to the Edit Account screen.

④Delete button

It will delete the selected accounts.

⑤Page switchover buttons

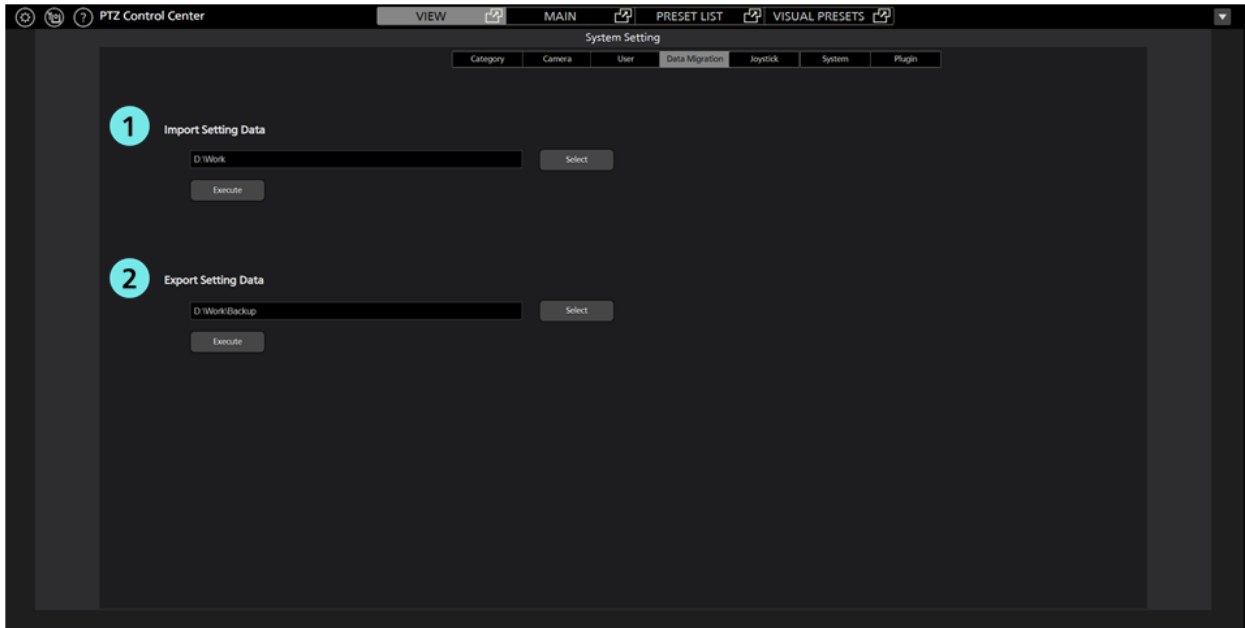
You can switchover to the page you want to see.

Settings – Data Migration Screen

This screen is for copying the setting data between the software programs running on another PC.

Clicking the Settings button located at the top left of the screen and selecting the Data Migration tab at the center of the screen will change the display to this screen.

For the details of copying the settings data, refer to "Copying the settings data" in this document.



① Import Setting Data field

This is used when importing setting data from other PC.

② Export Setting Data field

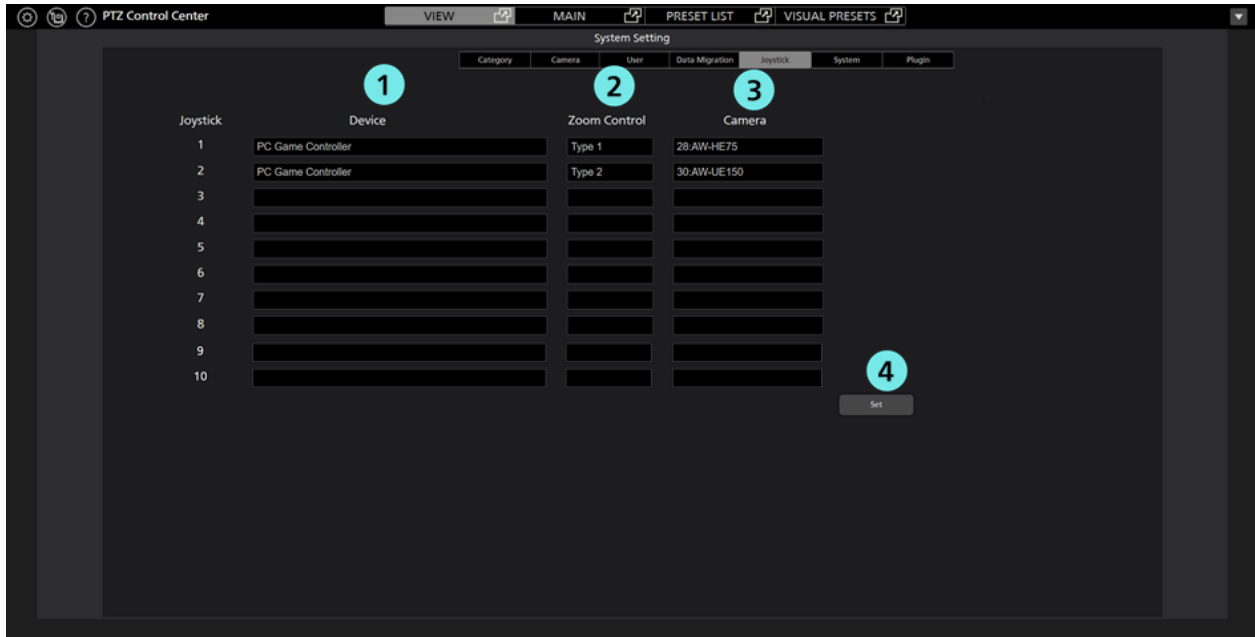
This is used when exporting setting data to other PC.

Settings – Joystick screen

This screen allows you to configure settings when operating the PTZ camera with a game controller connected to your PC.

Click the Settings button at the top left of the screen and select the Joystick tab to move to this screen.

For details of the settings, refer to “Operation of cameras” → “Operating the Camera with a Game Controller” in this document.



① Game controller device setting field

Select the game controller device that will operate the PTZ camera.

② Game controller zoom operation setting field

Select from 5 ways to operate the PTZ camera zoom with the game controller.

③ Setting field for PTZ camera to be operated

Select the PTZ camera to be operated by the game controller.

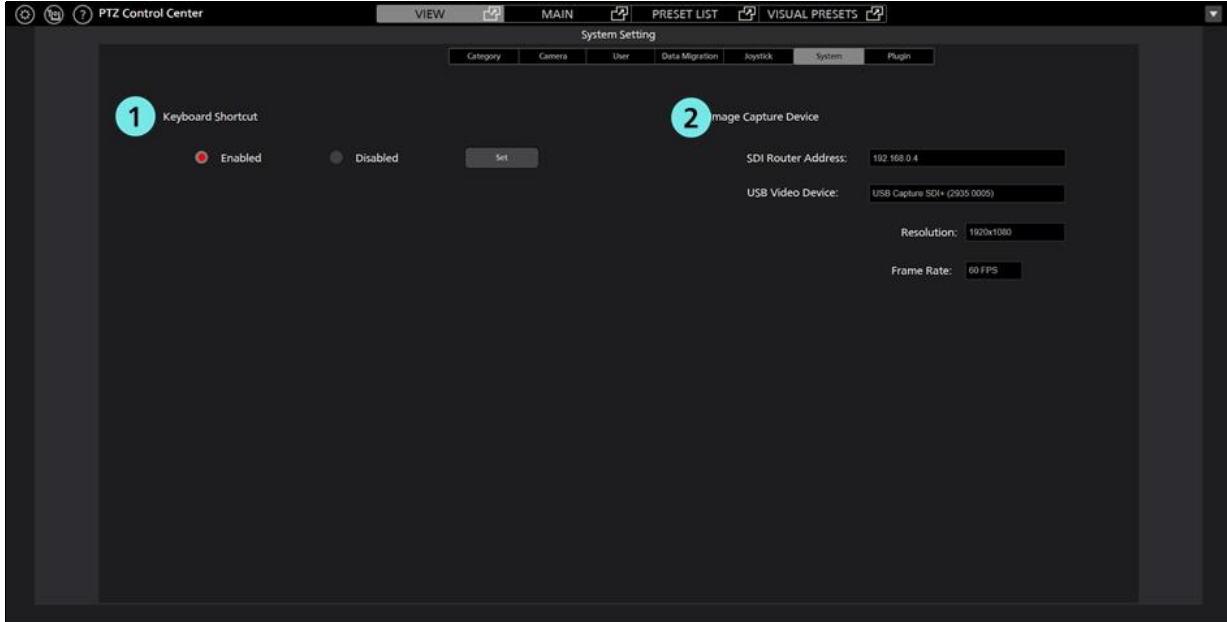
④ Set button

Applies the settings.

Settings - System Screen

This screen is for configuring the settings of the keyboard and image capture device connected to the PC.

Click the Settings in the top left of the screen and then select the System tab in the middle of the screen to get to this screen.



① Keyboard operation settings field

This sets whether to enable or disable PTZ camera operation from the keyboard.

② Image capture device setting field

This setting field is displayed only when the paid option AW-SF300 is enabled.

Set the image capture device to use when displaying the SDI output image from the PTZ camera with this software.

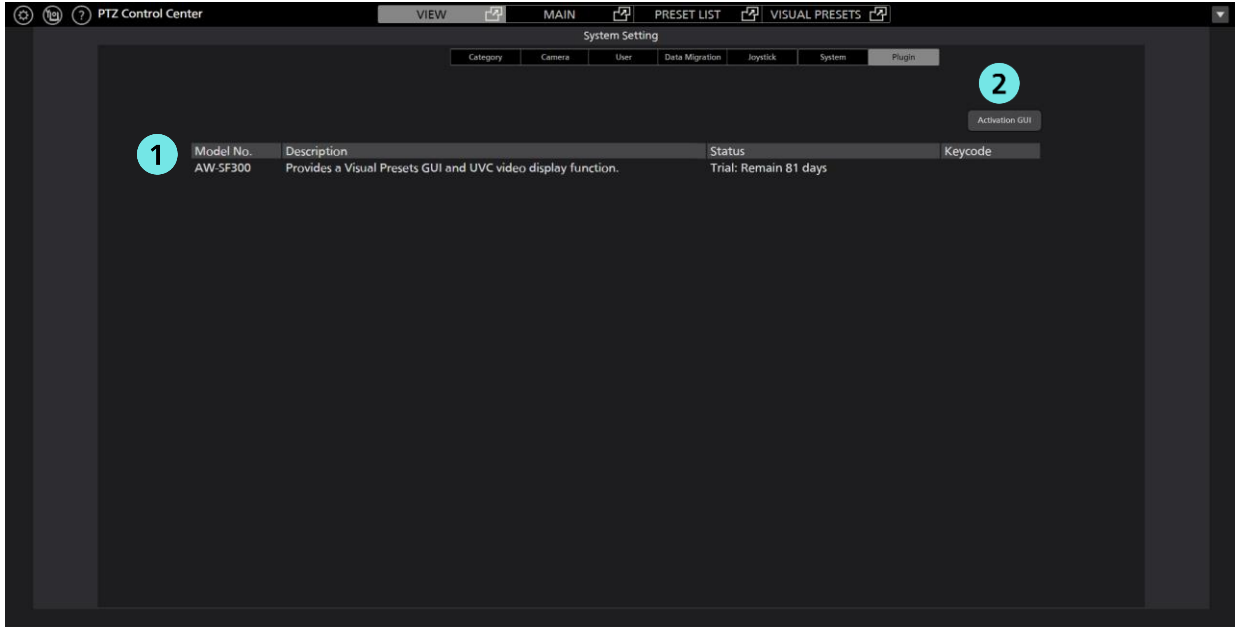
For details, refer to “Paid optional features” → “Camera SDI Output Image Display” in this document.

Settings – Plugin Screen

This screen manages the licenses for the paid options (plugins) used with this software.

Click the Settings button at the top left of the screen and select the Plugin tab to move to this screen.

For details, refer to “Paid Options” → “License Management” in this document.



① Status display field for paid options

Displays the license status of paid options (plugins) used with this software.

② Activation GUI button

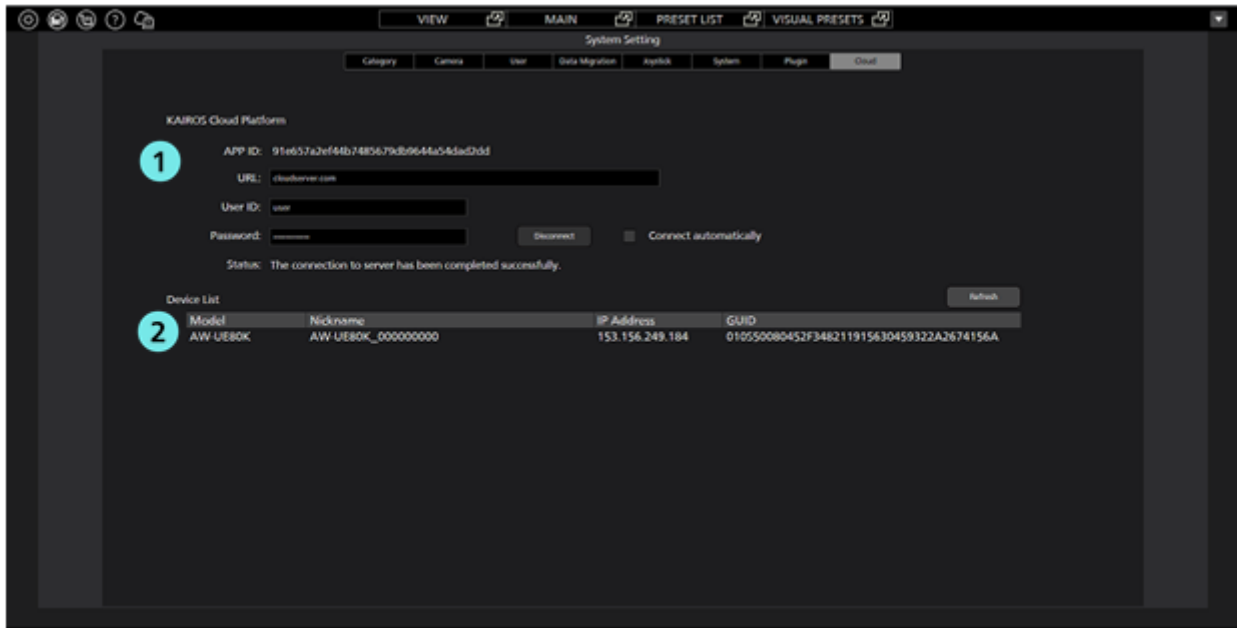
Launches the activation application.

Settings – Cloud screen

Screen to link with the KAIROS Cloud Platform.

Clicking the Setting button at the top left of the screen and selecting the Cloud tab or clicking the Cloud button at the top left of the screen will move to this screen.

For details, refer to "KAIROS Cloud Linkage Function."



① KAIROS Cloud Platform login field

For logging into the KAIROS Cloud Platform.

② Camera information display field

Displays list of cameras that are to be controlled via KAIROS Cloud Platform.

Default Settings 1 (Camera Settings)

Please set the camera before using the software.

The following three camera types are supported.

- **PTZ Camera + SUB Camera**

Image of the PTZ camera is displayed on the top screen and image of the control assist camera AW-HEA10 or AW-UE4 is displayed on the bottom screen, and PTZ operation is performed.

- **PTZ Camera + Image**

Image of PTZ camera is displayed on the top screen and panorama still image considering the usage environment is displayed on the bottom screen, and PTZ operation is performed. Panorama still image can be created by using PTZ camera.

- **PTZ Camera**

Only displays videos of PTZ cameras and Camcoders for PTZ operation or quality adjustment.

Details required to be set differ depending on the Camera Type. Procedure for each Camera Type is explained here.

<Note>

- For Camcorder (AG-CX350, AJ-CX4000), only PTZ Camera type can be used.

Select PTZ Camera as the type and configure settings according to the description in the "Setting of PTZ Camera."

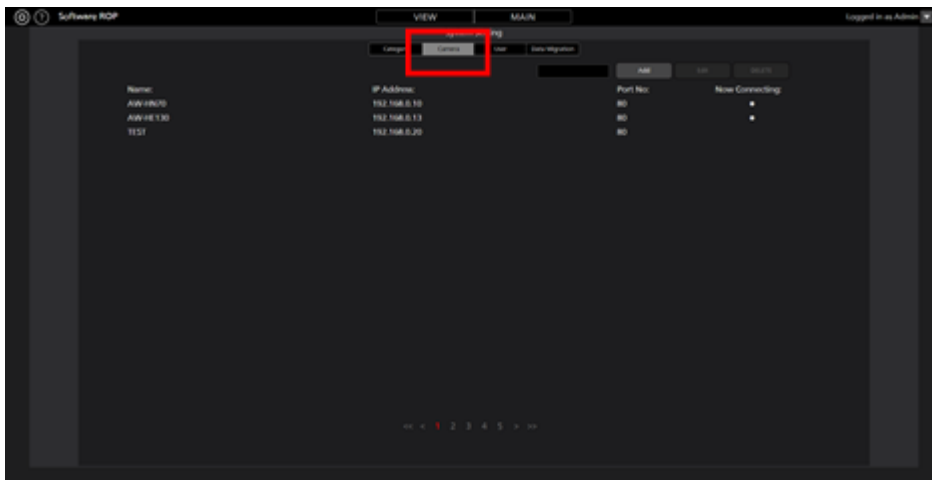
Setting of PTZ Camera + SUB Camera

- **Camera setting procedure**

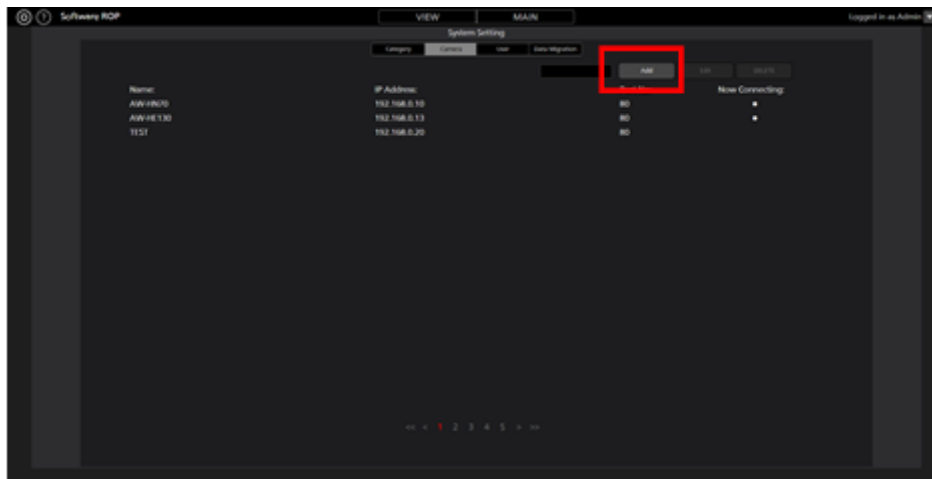
1. Login to the software.
2. The View screen will appear. Click the Settings button located at the top left of the screen.



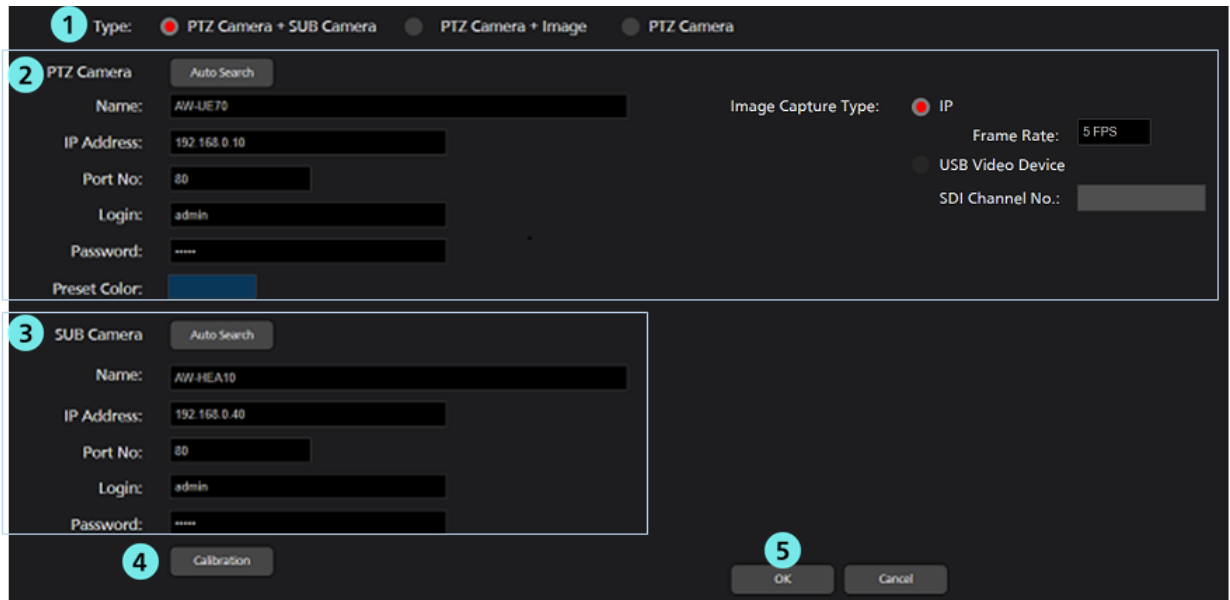
3. Click the Camera tab at the center of the Settings screen.



4. Click the Add button and go to the Register Camera screen.



5. Set the information of PTZ camera and Sub camera respectively.



(1) In the Type field, select [PTZ Camera + SUB Camera].

(2) Enter the information of PTZ camera in the PTZ Camera field.

Name: Name of camera

IP Address: IP address of camera

PortNo: Port number used by the camera (default is 80)

Login: Camera's account

Password: Camera's password

Preset Color: Select an effective preset display color

Image Capture Type : Select the acquisition method for the PTZ camera image to be displayed with this software.

[IP]: Displays the image acquired from the PTZ camera via the network.

Select this for normal operation.

Set the frame rate of the camera image displayed on the Main screen using Frame Rate.

[USB Video Device]: Select when displaying the SDI output image from the PTZ camera using a commercially available SDI to UVC converter.

This item is displayed only when the paid option AW-SF300 is enabled. For details, refer to "Paid optional features" → "Camera SDI Output Image Display" in this document.

You can manually enter the items or search the camera and automatically enter the items.

- When entering manually

Move to the box of each item and enter the value.

- When entering automatically

Clicking the Auto Search button of the PTZ Camera field will display the list of cameras present on the network. Selecting either of the cameras from the list and closing the window by pressing the OK button will automatically enter some of the items.

(3) Enter the information of the control assist camera AW-HEA10 or AW-UE4 in the Sub Camera field.

Input method is same as the PTZ Camera field.

(4) Click the Calibration button and go to the Calibration screen for doing calibration. Refer to "Default Settings 1 - Calibration" in this document for more details.

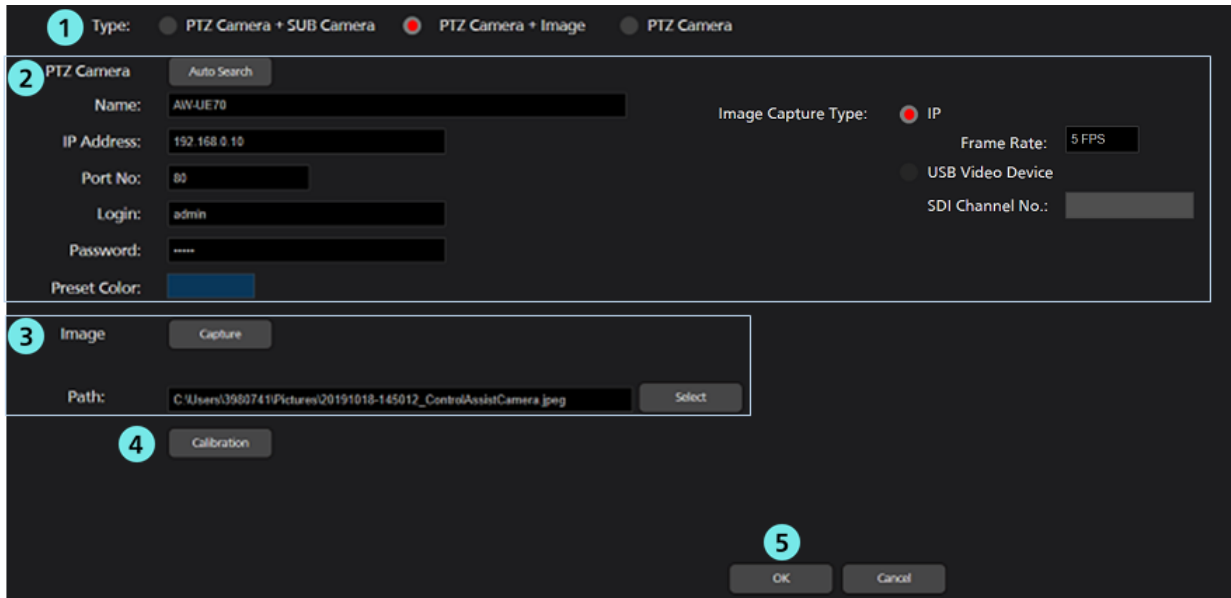
(5) Click the OK button to come out of the Register Camera screen.

6. With this, the setting is complete.

Setting of PTZ Camera + Image

• Camera setting procedure

1. Go to the Register Camera screen following the same steps as steps 1 through 4 described in "Setting of PTZ Camera + SUB Camera" above.
2. Set the information of PTZ camera and still image respectively.



(1) In the Type field, select [PTZ Camera + Image].

(2) Enter the information of PTZ camera in the PTZ Camera field.

Input method is same as the "Setting of PTZ Camera + SUB Camera."

(3) Set the still image to be displayed in the bottom screen in the Image field.

There are two ways of setting the still image, namely, setting an existing image available on PC, and creating and setting a panorama image considering the usage environment by using the PTZ camera.

- When setting an existing image available on PC

Clicking the Select button will show the file selection dialog window. Select the still image that you want to display in the bottom screen.

- When creating and setting a panorama image

Refer to "Procedure of creating panorama images" described later.

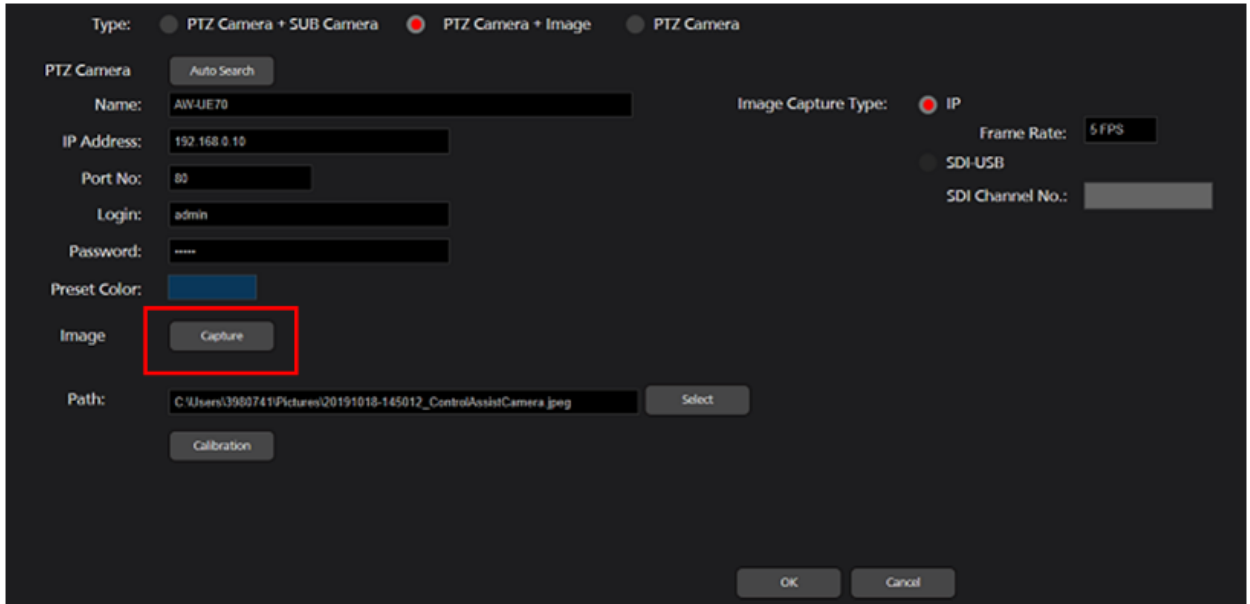
(4) Click the Calibration button and go to the Calibration screen for doing calibration. Refer to "Default Settings 1 - Calibration" in this document for more details.

(5) Click the OK button to come out of the Register Camera screen.

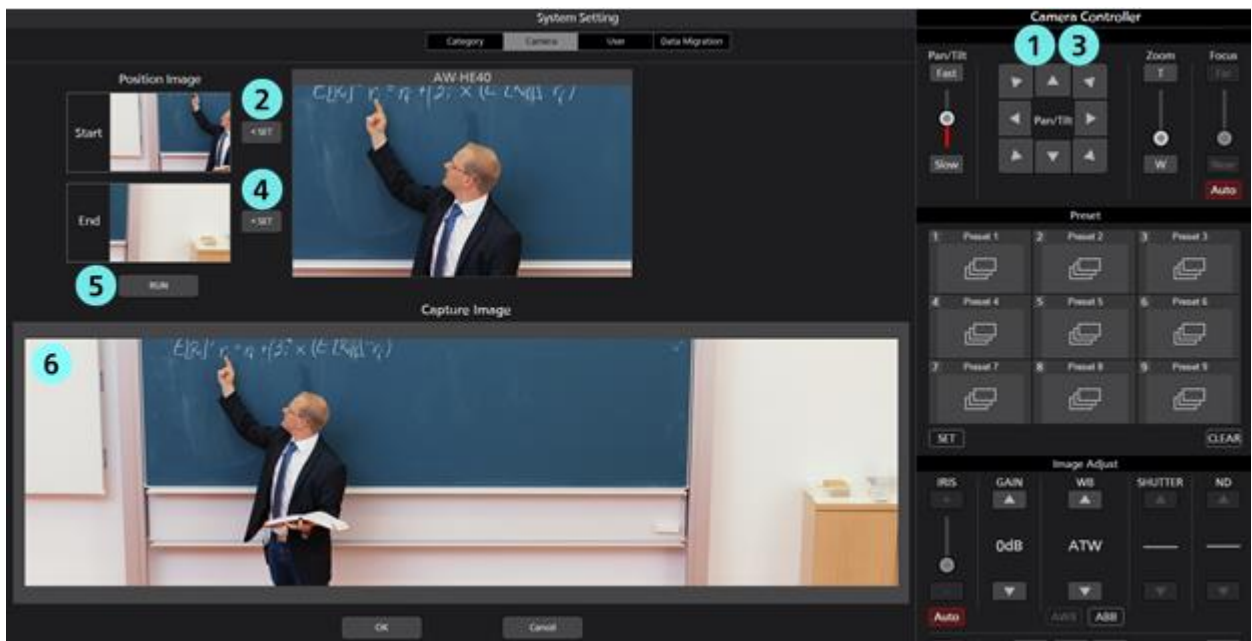
6. With this, the setting is complete.

- Procedure of creating panorama images

1. Click the Capture button on the Register Camera screen.



2. The Create Panorama Image screen will open. Create a panorama image with the following steps.



- (1) Use the Pan/Tilt buttons of the camera controller and move the PTZ camera to the starting position of the panorama image.
- (2) Click the SET button of the Position Image - Start field.
Image of the starting position will be set (it may take about few second before the setting is complete).
- (3) Use the Pan/Tilt buttons of the camera controller and move the PTZ camera to the ending position of the panorama image.
- (4) Click the SET button of the Position Image - End field.
Image of the ending position will be set (it may take about few second before the setting is complete).
- (5) Clicking the RUN button located at the bottom of the Position Image field will automatically move the PTZ camera from the starting position until the ending position you set, and panorama image will be created.

(6) Once creation of the panorama image is complete, the panorama image created will appear in the Capture Image field.

3. Click the OK button at the bottom of the screen to come out of the Create Panorama Image screen.

File of the panorama image you created will be automatically set in the Image - Path field of the Register Camera screen.

<Note>

- Check the following points when the panorama image is not created correctly.
 - When there is a moving object between the starting position and the ending position, remove this object and recreate the image.
 - Recreate the image after changing the starting position and the ending position.
- A panorama image cannot be created with the AW-UE4 PTZ camera.

Setting of PTZ Camera

1. Go to the Register Camera screen following the same steps as steps 1 through 4 described in "Setting of PTZ Camera + SUB Camera" above.
2. Enter the information of PTZ camera or Camcoder.

(1) In the Type field, select [PTZ Camera].

(2) Enter the information of PTZ camera in the PTZ Camera field.

Input method is same as the "Setting of PTZ Camera + SUB Camera."

(3) Click the OK button to come out of the Register Camera screen.

3. With this, the setting is complete.

Calibration

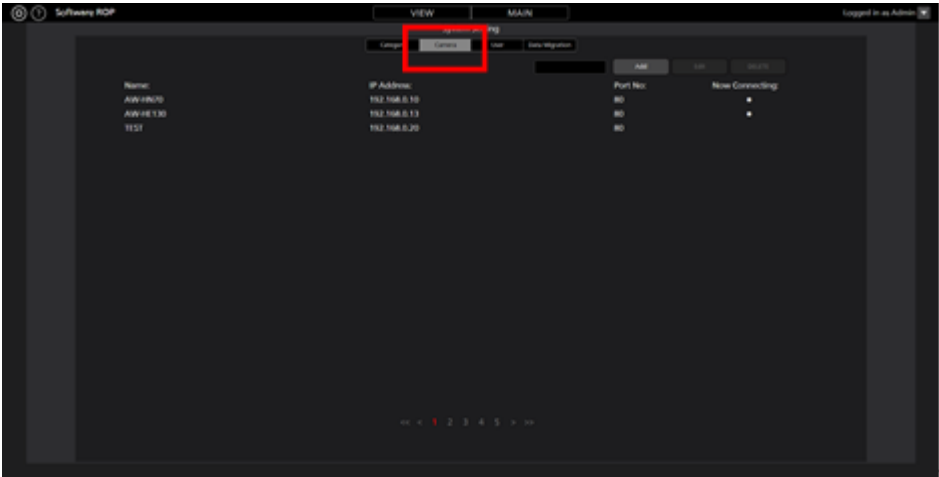
When either [PTZ Camera + SUB Camera] or [PTZ Camera + Image] is selected in Camera Type, it is necessary to perform calibration for correctly adjusting the positional relation of the top screen and the bottom screen.

Perform calibration as per the following steps.

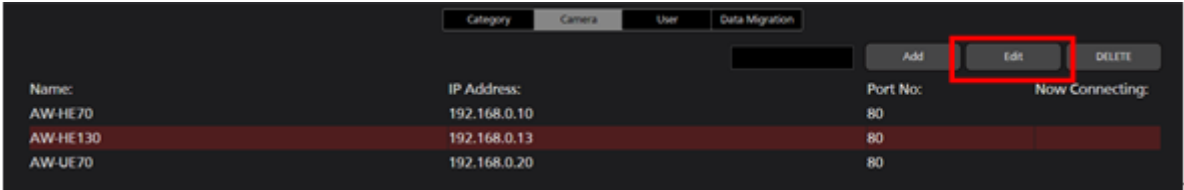
- 1. Login to the software.
- 2. The View screen will appear. Click the Settings button located at the top left of the screen.



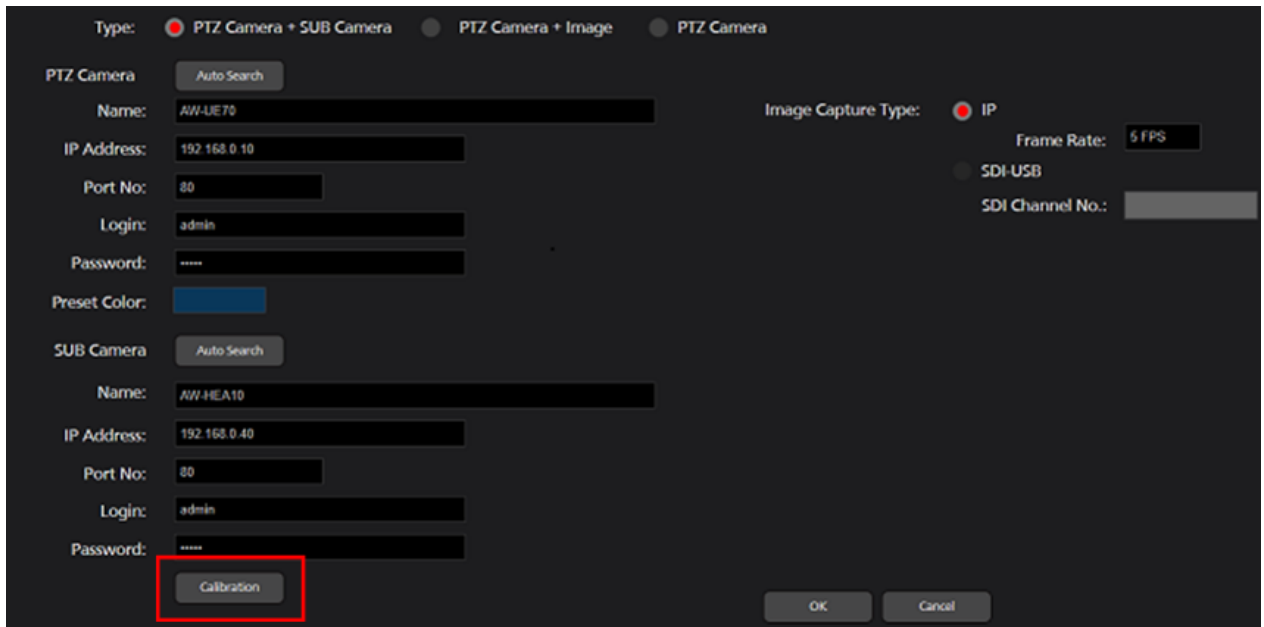
- 3. Click the Camera tab at the center of the Settings screen.



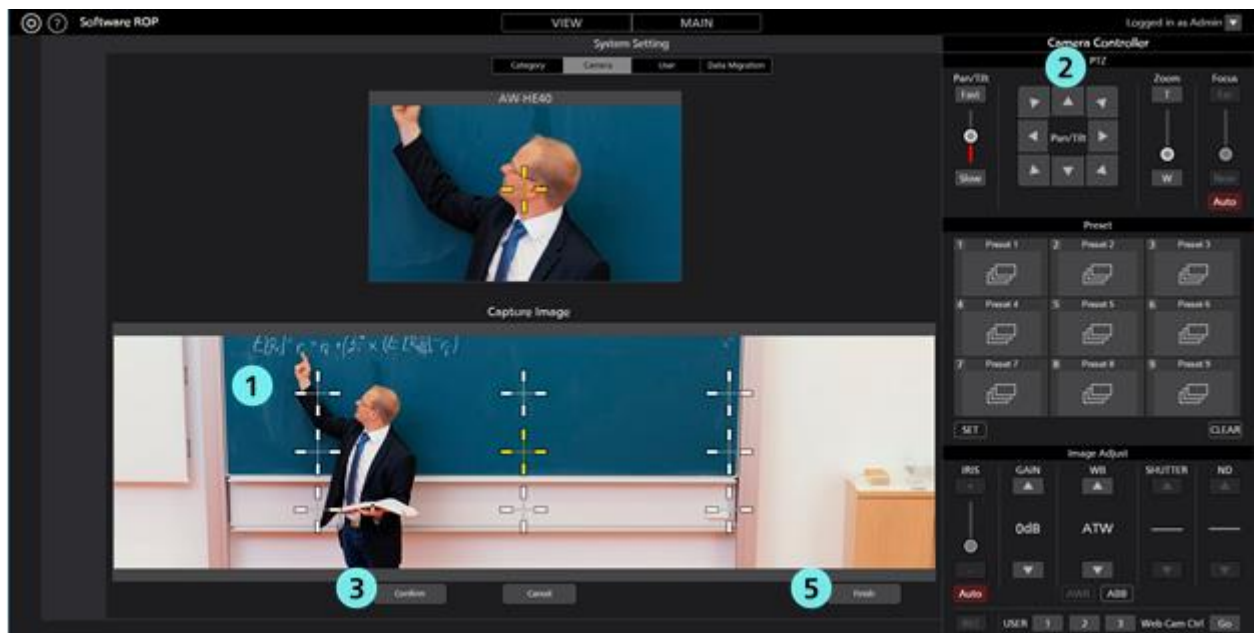
- 4. After selecting the target camera, click the Edit button and move to the Edit Camera screen.



- 5. Click the Calibration button on the Edit Camera screen.



6. The Calibration screen will appear. Perform calibration as per the following steps.



- (1) Click either of the white crosses appearing on the bottom screen and turn it into the selected state shown in yellow color.
- (2) Use the Pan/Tilt buttons of the camera controller and move the PTZ camera such that the center of the cross selected in the bottom screen in step (1) and the center of the cross in the top screen come to the same position.
- (3) Click the Confirm button. Yellow color cross will turn blue.
- (4) For all white crosses appearing in the bottom screen, perform steps (1) through (3) above.
- (5) Click the Finish button to come out of the Calibration screen.

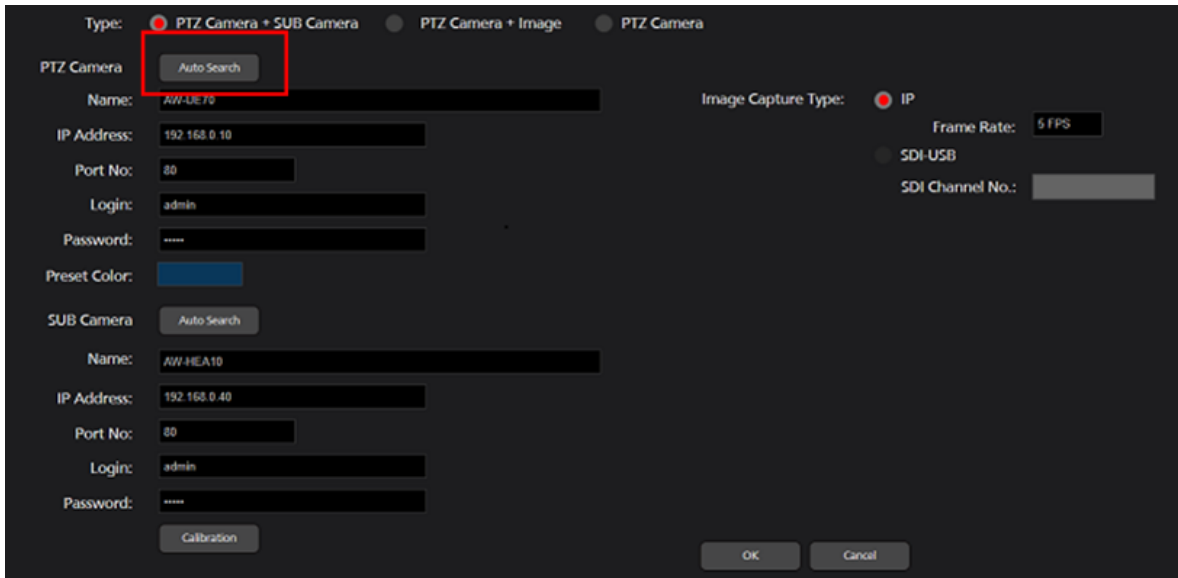
7. With this, the calibration is complete.

Changing network settings

You can change the network settings of the camera from the software.

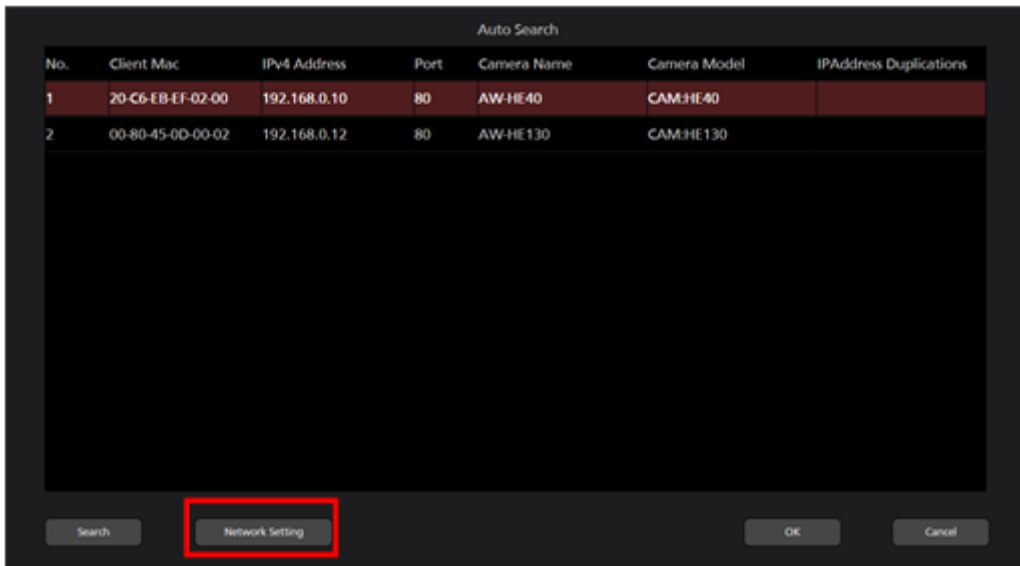
You can make settings as per the following steps.

1. Go to the Edit Camera screen following the same steps as steps 1 through 4 of "Default Settings 1 - Calibration."
2. Click the Auto Search button on the Edit Camera screen.

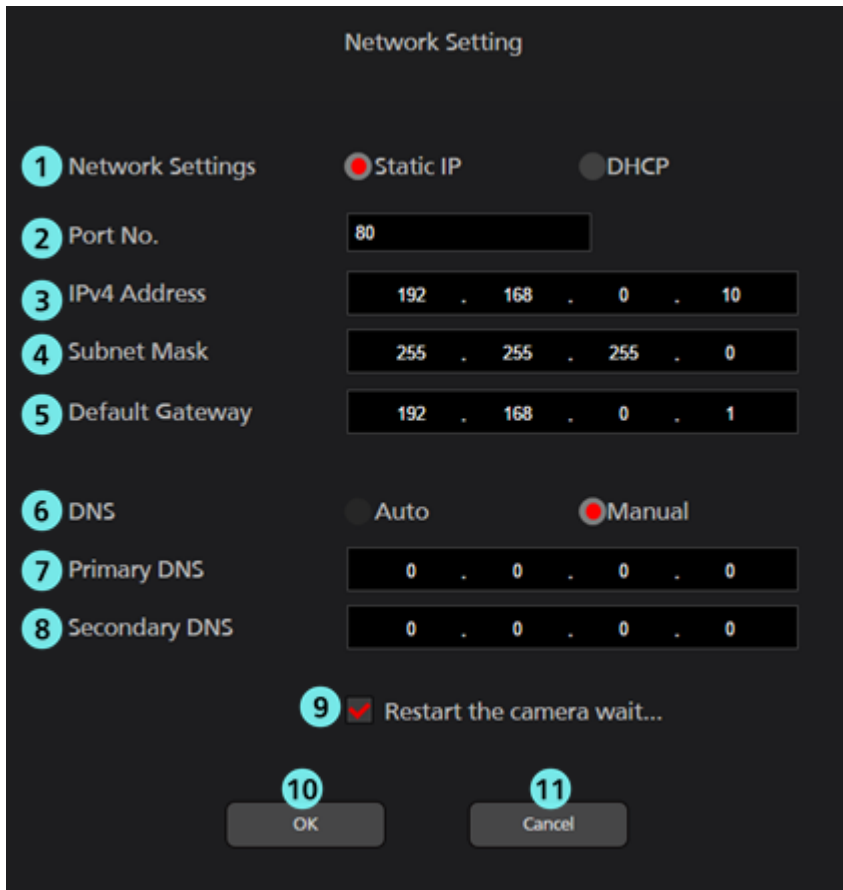


3. List of cameras present on the network will appear.

Select the cameras to be set and click the Network Setting button.



4. The Network Settings screen will open. Changing each item and clicking the OK button will change the network settings of the camera.



① Network Settings

You can select the setting method of IP address.

Static IP: Setting is done with fixed IP.

DHCP: Setting is done with DHCP.

② Port No.

It sets the port number to be used by the camera.

③ IPv4 Address

It sets the IP address of the camera.

This can be set only when Static IP is selected in Network Settings.

④ Subnet Mask

It sets the subnet mask of the camera.

This can be set only when Static IP is selected in Network Settings.

⑤ Default Gateway

It sets the gateway of the camera.

This can be set only when Static IP is selected in Network Settings.

⑥ DNS

You can select the setting method of DNS server.

Auto: It automatically sets the DNS server.

Manual: You can directly specify the address of the DNS server.

⑦ Primary DNS

It sets the address of the primary DNS.

This can be set only when Manual is selected in DNS.

⑧ Secondary DNS

It sets the address of the secondary DNS.

This can be set only when Manual is selected in DNS.

⑨ Restart the camera wait

When this box is checked and when the setting is changed by clicking the OK button, the camera will standby until the setting is completed.

⑩ OK button

It will apply the settings and close the screen.

⑪ Cancel button

It will cancel the settings and close the screen.

<Note>

- When EasyIpSetup software and this software are used at the same time, network setting from this software is not available.

Default Settings 2 (Other Settings)

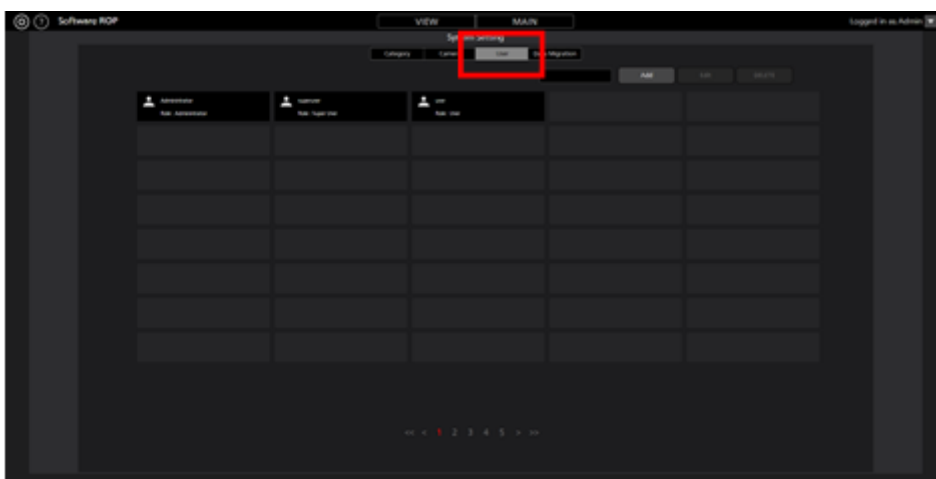
User account settings

Please set the user account before using the software.

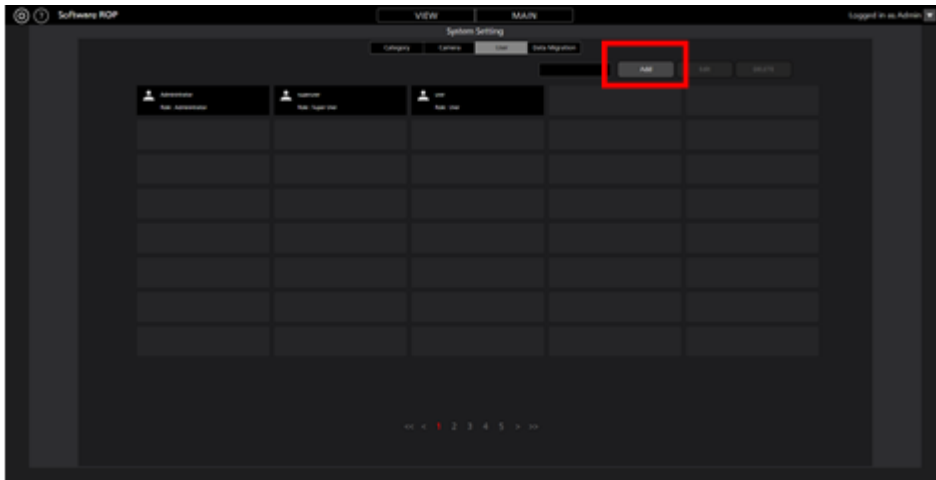
1. Login to the software.
2. The View screen will appear. Click the Settings button located at the top left of the screen.



3. Click the User tab at the center of the Settings screen.



4. Click the Add button and go to the Register User screen.



5. On the Register User screen, enter the information of the user account to be registered.

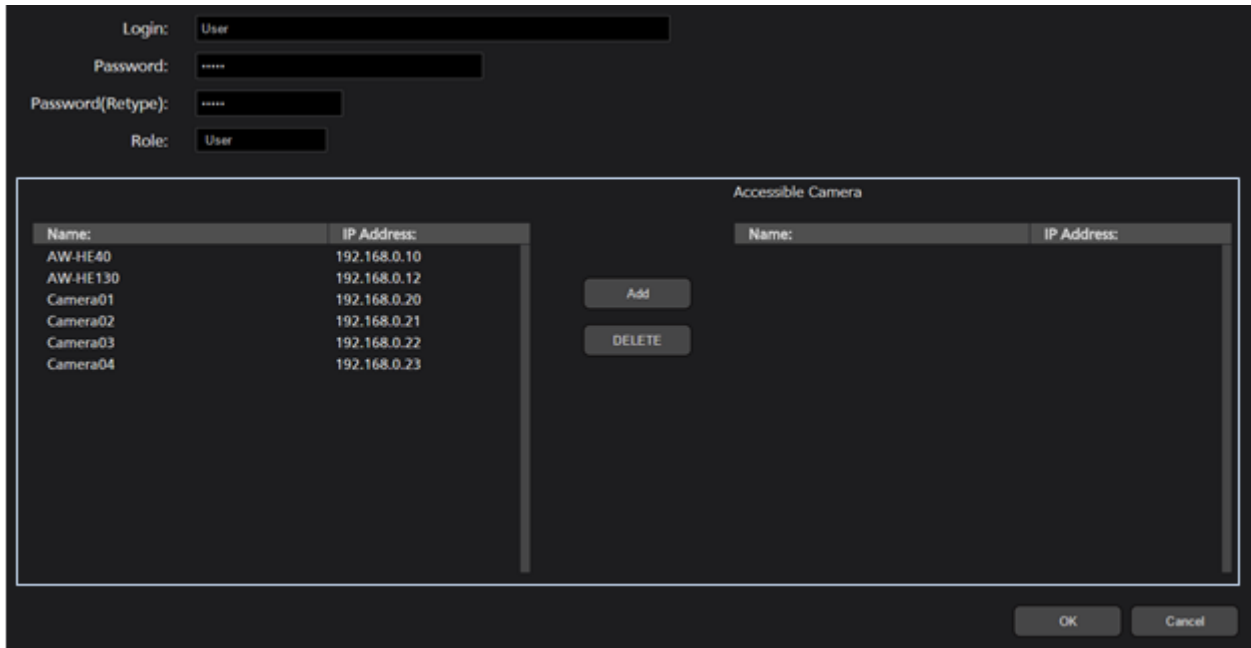

6. When User is selected in Role of the user account, access permission setting areas (blue frame in the following figure) of the camera will appear at the bottom of the Register User screen. Here, you can set the cameras that the user is allowed to access.



- (1) List of the cameras registered at present would appear in the list on the left side of the setting area. Select the cameras to which you want to allow the access.
- (2) Clicking the Add button at the center of the setting area will move the camera selected in step (1) to the list on the right side of the setting area.

When the user subjected to registration at present has logged in, only those cameras that are there in the list on the right side of the setting area will appear in the list of cameras on the View/Main screen.

- (3) When deleting the cameras to which you had allowed the access, select the cameras from the list on the right side of the setting area and click the DELETE button in the center of the setting area.

7. Click the OK button to come out of the Register User screen.

8. With this, the setting is complete.

- For the details of the functions that the respective user privilege can use, refer to "Appendix - List of restrictions for each account privilege" in this document.

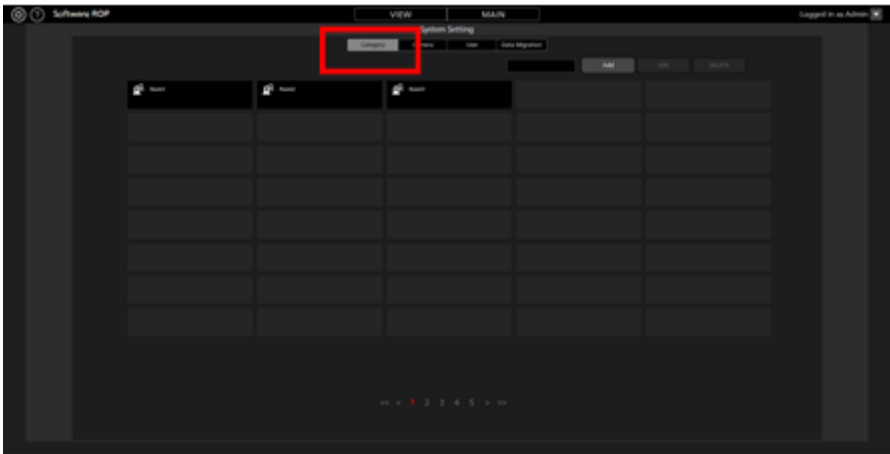
Category settings of camera

If required, set the category of the camera (group of the camera).

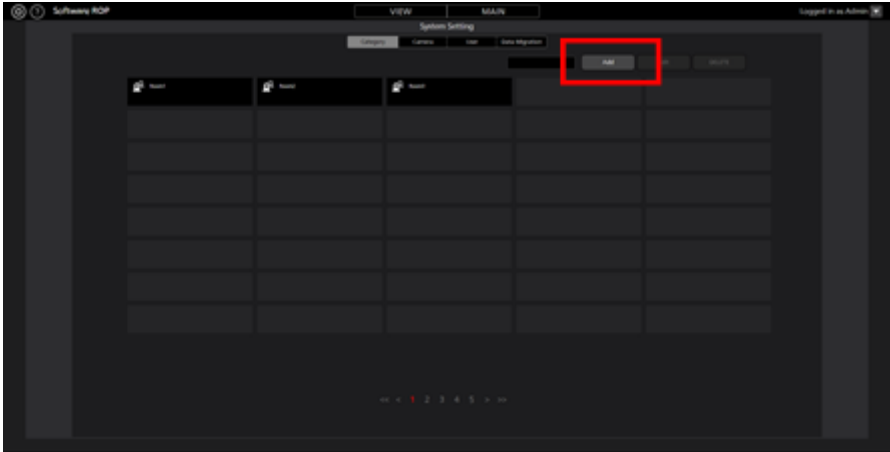
- 1. Login to the software.
- 2. The View screen will appear. Click the Settings button located at the top left of the screen.



- 3. Click the Category tab at the center of the Settings screen.



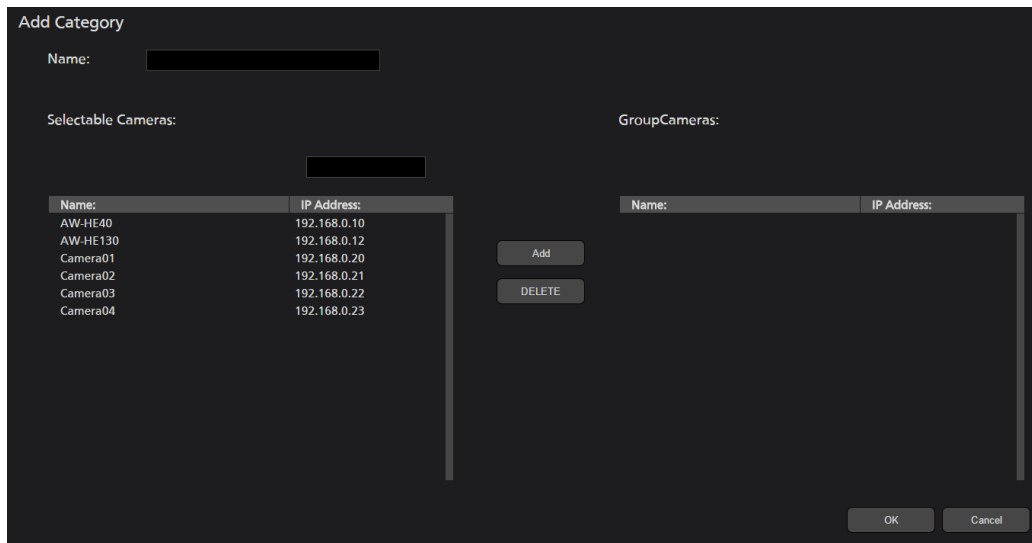
- 4. Click the Add button and go to the Register Category screen.



5. Register categories on the Register Category screen.

(1) Enter the name of the category to be registered in Name.

(2) From the list of cameras on the left side, select the cameras that you want to register in the category and click the Add button. This will add the cameras to the category (cameras will move to the list on the right side).



6. Click the OK button to come out of the Register Category screen.

7. With this, the setting is complete.

Operation of cameras

The method of operation of only one camera with the software is explained here.

Camera selection

Use the following procedure to select the camera you wish to control.



1. Click the Main tab located in the center at the top of the software and go to the Main screen.
2. In the list of cameras on the left side of the Main screen, click and select the camera you want to operate.
You can also select a camera on the View screen.
3. Click the [Selected Single Camera] tab located at the top of the Main screen.
4. Image of the camera you selected will appear in the center of the Main screen.

Details that are displayed would differ depending on the Camera Type.

- For PTZ Camera + SUB Camera

Top screen: Image of PTZ camera

Bottom screen: Image of the control assist camera AW-HEA10 or AW-UE4

- For PTZ Camera + Image

Top screen: Image of PTZ camera

Bottom screen: Still image that is set

- For PTZ Camera

Top screen: Image of PTZ camera or Camcoder

Bottom screen: None

5. The camera is operated using the methods noted in “Operating the Camera from the Camera Image,” “Operating the Camera with the Camera Controller,” “Operating the Camera with a Keyboard,” and “Operating the Camera with a Game Controller” below.

<Note>

- When thumbnails are OFF in the camera list display and when image does not appear even after selecting a camera, check that the network connection between the PC and the camera is correctly done.

Operating the Camera from the Camera Image

You can perform the following operations with the image from the selected camera displayed in the center of the main screen.

- Pan/Tilt the PTZ camera by clicking on the upper screen or lower screen

By clicking on the upper screen or lower screen, the PTZ camera performs Pan/Tilt operations so that the point you clicked is in the center of the screen.

- Pan/Tilt/Zoom the PTZ camera by specifying an area on the upper screen or lower screen

By clicking and dragging on the upper screen or lower screen, you can specify an area with a yellow box. When you stop dragging and fix the area, the PTZ camera performs Pan/Tilt/Zoom operations so that the specified area is displayed in a full screen.

- Zoom the PTZ camera by using the mouse wheel on the upper screen

When the mouse cursor is on the upper screen, you can zoom the PTZ camera by using the mouse wheel.

<Note>

- If the movement position of the PTZ camera when clicking the bottom screen is not accurate, refer to "Default Settings 1 - Calibration" in this document and perform calibration.
- Pan/Tilt operation cannot be executed for POVCAM and Camcoder.

Operating the Camera with the Camera Controller

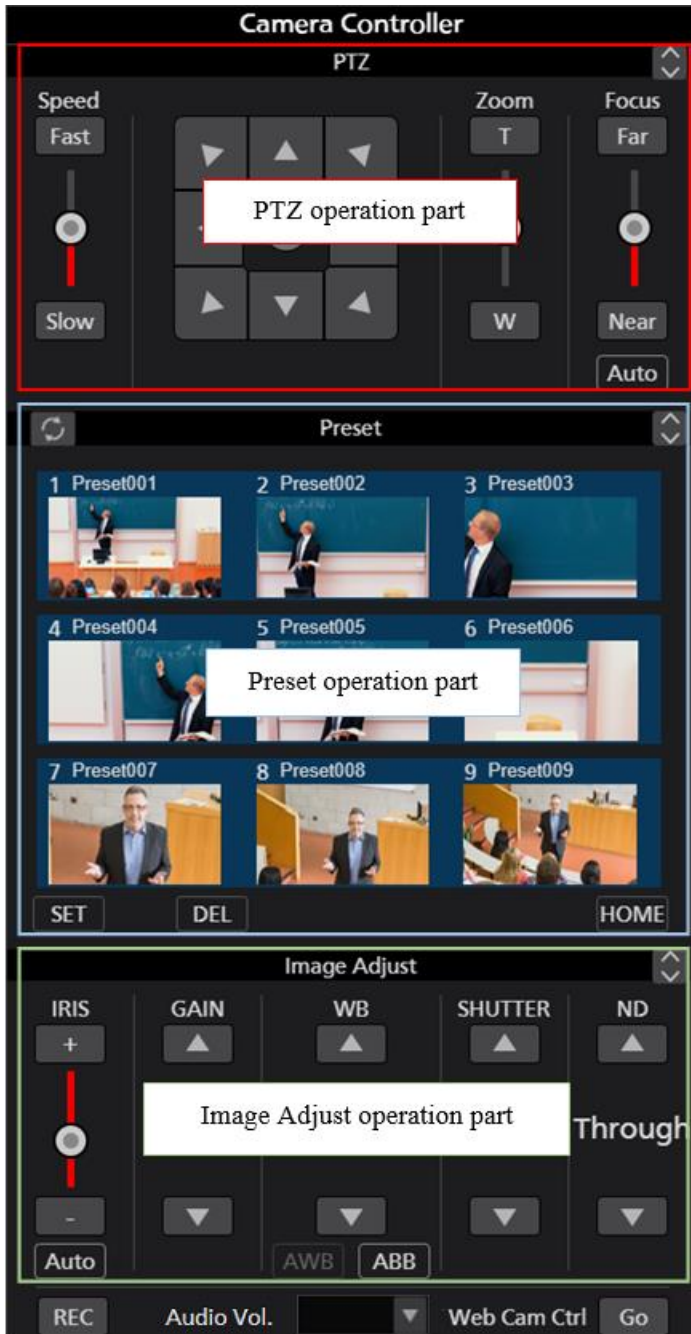
With camera controller, you can perform various operations of cameras.

The following operations are supported.

Display of the camera controller and possible operations differ for cameras that are PTZ camera/POVCAM and for Camcoders.

- PTZ operation
- Preset operation
- Image quality adjustment
- Start/Stop SD card recording
- Web screen calling

■ Descriptions of each operation part (for PTZ camera/POVCAM)



PTZ operation part:

You can operate the Pan/Tilt, Zoom, Focus of the PTZ camera.


Preset operation part:


You can register, call, or delete a preset for the PTZ camera.

Image Adjusting operation part:

You can adjust the image of the PTZ camera.

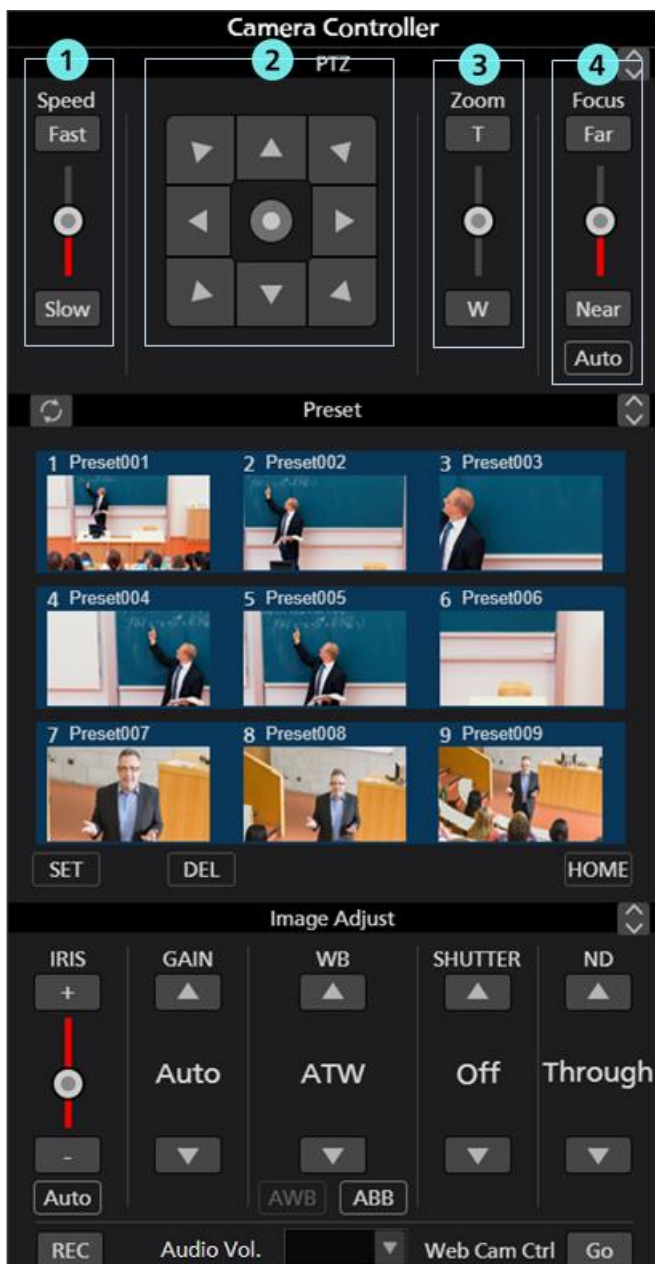
<Note>

- Clicking the  button on the top right of each operation part will enlarge the display.

Clicking the  button with the enlarged display will return the display to normal.

• PTZ operation

You can operate the Pan/Tilt, Zoom, Focus of the PTZ camera.



① Pan/Tilt speed control part

You can set the moving speed when moving the camera with the Fast/Slow buttons or the slider. Red color bar in the slider shows the current setting value.

② Pan/Tilt buttons

Clicking any of the arrow buttons will move the camera in the directions corresponding to the arrow.

Clicking on the slider in the middle will change the display and enables moving the camera in an optional direction.

③ Zoom position control part

You can set the Zoom position of the camera with the T/W buttons or the slider.

Red color bar in the slider shows the current setting value.

④ Focus control part

Clicking Auto will switch AutoFocus between ON/OFF.

When AutoFocus is ON, the camera will automatically set the Focus.

When AutoFocus is OFF, you can set the Focus of camera with the Far/Near buttons and the slider.

• Preset operation

You can register, call, or delete a preset for the PTZ camera.

In addition, each of the presets may optionally be given a name.

When a preset is registered, the background color of the thumbnails is displayed with the color set in the Preset Color settings of the camera.



• Preset registration

1. Use the Pan/Tilt buttons and Zoom position control slider/buttons and move the camera to the position you want to register.
2. Turn ON (red color) the SET button located at the bottom left of the Preset area.
3. Clicking either of the thumbnails of Preset 1 through Preset 9 in the Preset area will register the current camera position in preset. Thumbnail at the time of registration will appear in the button.

• Preset calling

1. Turn OFF (gray color) the SET button and the DEL button located at the bottom left of the Preset Area.
2. Clicking either of the buttons of Preset 1 through Preset 9 in the Preset area will call the corresponding preset.


- **Preset deletion**

1. Turn ON (red color) the DEL button located at the bottom left of the Preset area.
2. Clicking either of the buttons of Preset 1 through Preset 9 in the Preset area will delete the corresponding preset.

- **Changing preset names**

1. Change the SET button in the bottom left of the Preset area to ON (red).
2. Clicking on the name displayed on the thumbnail launches name editing and enables input of any name.

- **Update preset display**

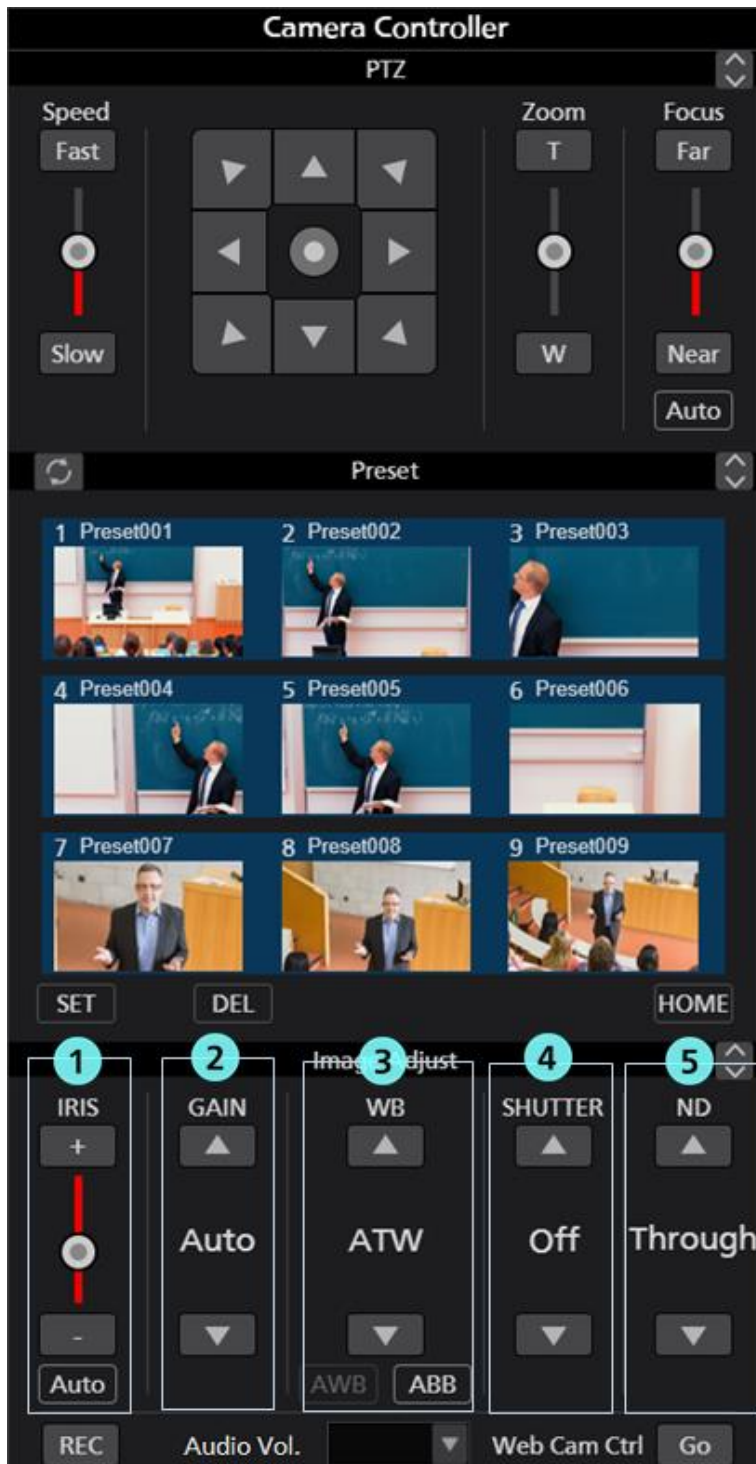
Clicking on the  button in the top left of the Preset area will retrieve the latest preset data from the camera and update the display.

- **Image quality adjustment**

You can adjust the image quality of the camera.

You can adjust the following items.

Iris / Gain / White Balance / Shutter / ND Filter



① Iris control part

Clicking Auto will switch AutoIris between ON/OFF.

When AutoIris is ON, the camera will automatically set the Iris.

When AutoIris is OFF, you can set the Iris of camera with the +/- buttons and the slider.

② Gain control part

You can set the Gain of the camera with the up/down buttons.

③ White Balance control part

You can set the white balance mode of the camera with the up/down buttons.

By clicking the AWB button, the camera will automatically adjust white balance.

By clicking the ABB button, the camera will automatically adjust black balance.

④ Shutter control part

You can set the Shutter of the camera with the up/down buttons.

⑤ ND Filter part

You can set the ND Filter of the camera with the up/down buttons.

<Note>

- You may not be able to adjust some of the items depending on the combination of camera type and operating mode. Refer to the operations manual of each camera for more details.

• Start/Stop SD card recording

You can Start/Stop recording of a camera that has the SD card recording function.

Clicking the REC button located at the bottom left of camera controller with the camera in the recordable state will switch between recording start/stop at every click. When the camera is recording, the REC button will turn red, and when the recording is stopped, the REC button will turn gray.

• Audio volume adjustment

Volume of audio of the camera can be adjusted with Audio Vol. part at the bottom of the camera controller.

If the camera supports multiple audio Ch., The volume value for Ch.1 will be displayed and the settings will be made for Ch.1 and Ch.2.

• Web screen calling

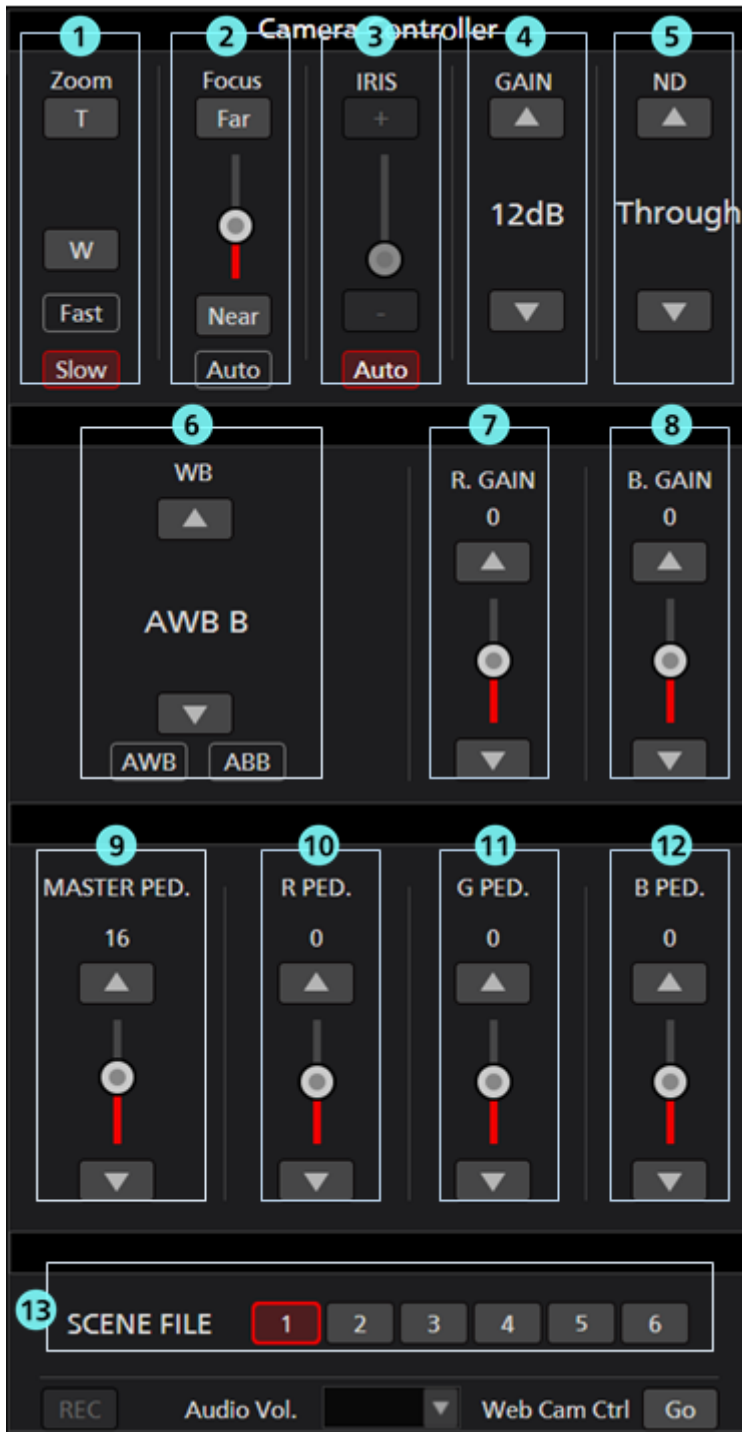
You can call the Web screen of the camera.

Clicking the Go button located at the bottom right of camera controller will open the Web Cam Management screen of the camera in the web browser.

<Note>

- A part of the Web Cam Management screen of the camera may not appear properly depending on the web browser you are using.

■ Description and operation of each parts (for Camcorder)



① Zoom control part

Operates the Zoom position of the camera with the T/W button.

Zoom speed can be switched with the Fast button and Slow button.

② Focus control part

ON/OFF of AutoFocus can be switched by clicking Auto.

Camera will automatically set Focus when AutoFocus is ON.

When AutoFocus is OFF, Focus of the camera can be set with the Far/Near button and slider.

③Iris control part

ON/OFF of AutoIris can be switched by clicking Auto.

Camera will automatically set Iris when AutoIris is ON.

When AutoIris is OFF, Iris of the camera can be set with the +/- button and slider.

④Gain control part

Sets Gain of the camera with the up/down button.

⑤ND Filter control part

Sets ND Filter of the camera with the up/down button.

⑥White Balance control part

Sets white balance mode of the camera with the up/down button.

Camera will automatically adjust white balance by clicking the AWB button.

Camera will automatically adjust black balance by clicking the ABB button.

⑦R. GAIN control part

Sets R. GAIN of the camera with the up/down button and slider.

⑧B. GAIN control part

Sets B. GAIN of the camera with the up/down button and slider.

⑨MASTER PED. control part

Sets master pedestal of the camera with the up/down button and slider.

⑩R. PED. control part

Sets R pedestal of the camera with the up/down button and slider.

⑪G. PED. control part

Sets G pedestal of the camera with the up/down button and slider.

⑫B. PED. control part

Sets B pedestal of the camera with the up/down button and slider.

⑬Scene file selection part

Selects scene file of the camera.

<Note>

- Audio volume adjustment does not function for Camcoders.

Operating the Camera with a Game Controller

You can use up to 10 game controllers connected to the PC to perform various operations on the PTZ camera.

• Supported operations

The operations supported are as follows.

- Camera Pan/Tilt/Zoom
- Preset call
- Switch selected camera

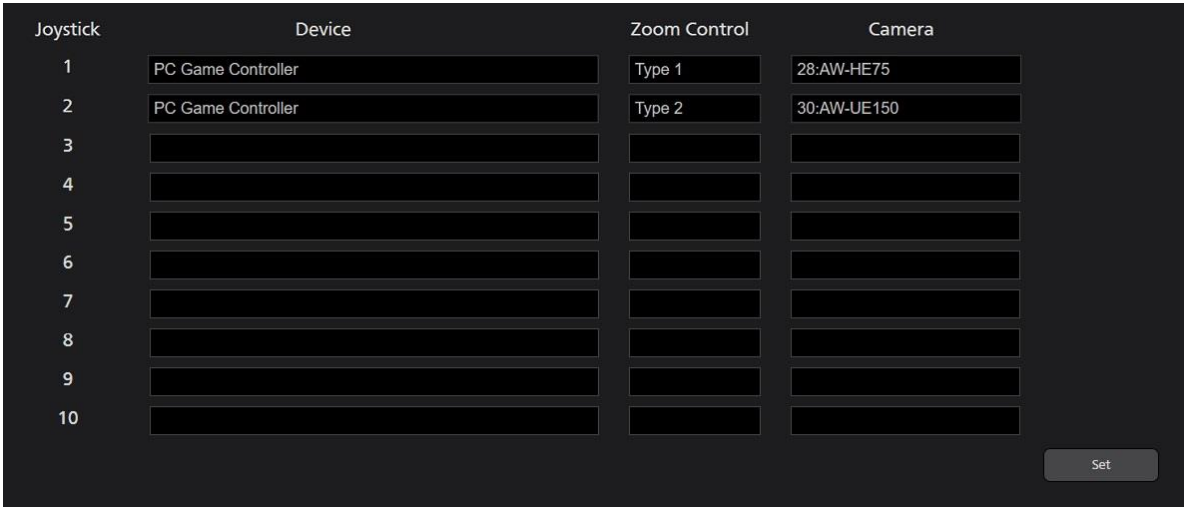
The allocation of operations to each axis/button on controllers is as below.

- X axis: Camera pan
- Y axis: Camera tilt
- Z axis: Camera pan/tilt speed change
- Rotate: Camera zoom (the rotation axis to be used can be set on the Settings – Joystick screen)
- Button: Camera preset call according to button number
- Hat switch: Switch selected camera

• Operation settings

Configure the settings on the Settings – Joystick screen.

After changing the settings, click the Set button to apply them.



- Device settings

Click the setting field to display a list of game controllers connected to the PC. Select the game controllers to use for operation.

- Zoom Control settings

Select from five types, Type 1 to Type 5, to decide the part of the joystick to which you wish to assign the zoom operation of the camera. The optimum settings differ depending on the model of the game controller. If the camera zoom does not work properly with the game controller you are using, try another Type.

- Camera settings

Select the camera to operate with the joystick.

Click the setting field to display the “Active Camera” item and a list of PTZ camera names registered in this software.

When “Active Camera” is selected, the camera selected on the VIEW/MAIN screen will be operated. When a specific camera is selected, only that camera can be operated regardless of the camera selection status on the VIEW/MAIN screen.

Select AW-RP150 if you want to use the joystick with the AW-RP150 linkage function.

<Note>

- If you connect the joystick to the PC after starting this software, this software may not recognize the joystick. In this case, please restart the software.
- You can check the axes, rotation, and button numbers allocated to the sticks and buttons of game controllers on the properties screen displayed by selecting Windows [Devices and Printers], right clicking on the controller icon, and selecting [Game Controller Settings] → [Properties].
- Please use Game Controller with DirectInput compatible products. If a game controller is switchable between Xinput and DirectInput, chose DirectInput.
- This software is not guaranteed to work on all game controllers

Please see the download website for this software to check which game controllers are confirmed to work.

Display of H.264 streaming images from camera

You can have full screen display of H.264 streaming images from the PTZ camera selected for operation.

The resolution and frame rate of H.264 streaming images displayed depend on the H.264 streaming settings for PTZ cameras.

The order of priority for H.264 streaming used for display is H.264 (1) → H.264 (2) → H.264 (3) → H.264 (4).

Please set one of the H.264 streams as follows on the PTZ camera web screen beforehand.

- H.264 transmission
Set one or more from H.264 (1) - H.264 (4) to On
- Image capture size
Specify one of the resolutions below.
3840x2160 / 1920x1080 / 1280x720 / 640x360 / 320x180
- Transmission priority
Set in frame rate
- Frame rate
Specify one of the frame rates below.
60fps / 50fps / 30fps / 25fps / 24fps / 15fps / 12.5fps / 5fps

To display H.264 streaming images, follow the procedure below.

1. Select a camera using the procedure in [Camera Selection] above to display the images from that camera on the main screen.
2. Double click the PTZ camera image displayed on the upper screen.
3. The H.264 streaming images from the PTZ camera are displayed full screen on the PC's primary display.
4. To end the display of H.264 streaming images, double click again or press ESC or Enter on the keyboard.

<Note>

If the camera password contains @, H.264 streaming images cannot be displayed.

Simultaneous Operation of Multiple Cameras

You can simultaneously operate multiple connected cameras.

Operation procedure

The operations for which simultaneous operation is possible are as follows.

- Pan/Tilt/Zoom the camera with buttons/slider
- Call a preset for the camera
- Image quality adjustment of the camera (Focus, Iris only)

You can perform operations as per the following steps.



1. Click the Main tab located in the center at the top of the software and go to the Main screen.
2. In the list of cameras on the left side of the Main screen, turn ON the check of the cameras you want to operate.

You can also check on the View screen.

3. Click the [Checked Multiple Camera] tab located at the top of the Main screen.
4. Image of the cameras selected for operation will appear in the center of the Main screen.
5. Operate the camera with one of the following methods.

The operation methods are the same as when using one camera. For the details, refer to the items in “Operation of cameras” in this document.

- Operate the camera using the camera controller in this software
- Operate the camera using a keyboard connected to the PC
- Operate the camera using a game controller connected to the PC

<Note>

- When thumbnails are OFF in the camera list display and when image does not appear even after selecting a camera, check that the network connection between the PC and the camera is correctly done.
- Cameras that are in the selected state in the camera list display can be operated irrespective of the check status.

Using the Preset List screen

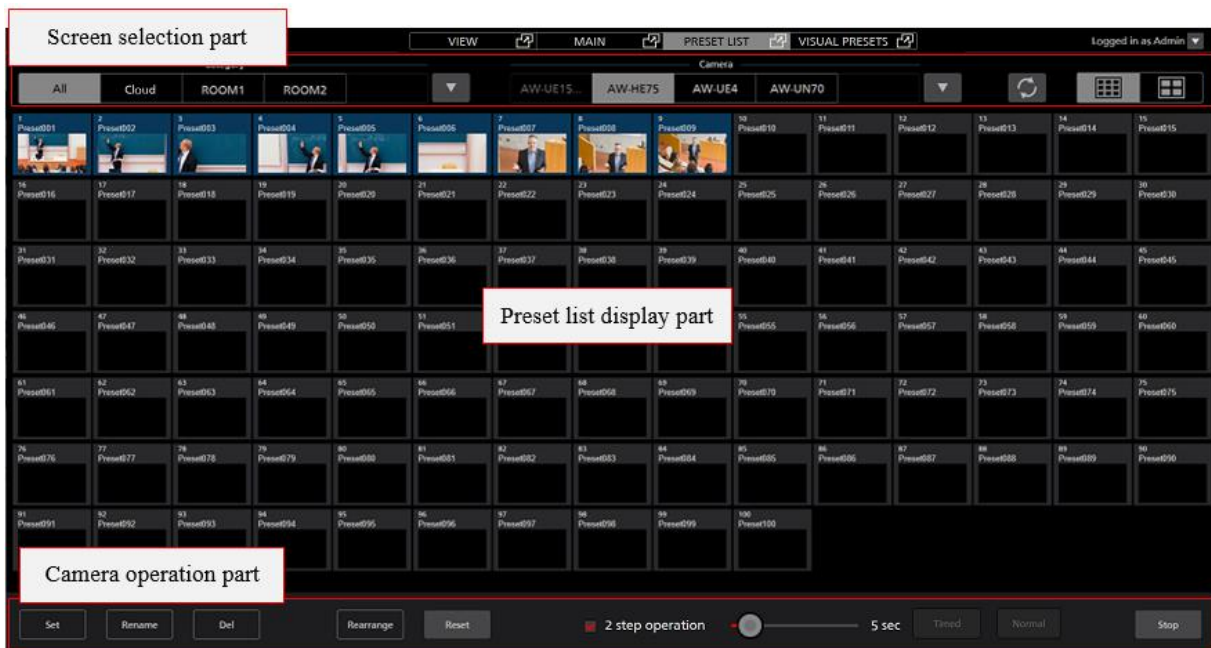
Clicking on the PRESET LIST tab at the top of the screen will display the Preset List screen.

This displays the camera presets in a list and makes it possible to call the presets.

Description of the screen

The screen is made up of three areas as listed below.

- Screen selection part
- Preset list display part
- Camera operation part



Preset List Screen

- **Screen selection part**

This is the area to select the camera to be displayed.



① **Camera category selection tab**

Select the camera category for the cameras to be displayed in the “② Camera selection tab.”

The tab will display a list of camera category names registered in “All” and in the Settings - Category screen.

If “All” is selected, all cameras registered in the software will become display targets.

When "Cloud" is selected, camera to be controlled with KAIROS Cloud linkage will be the display target.

If one of the categories is selected, only the cameras that are in that category are displayed.

If there are 5 or more categories, click the ▼ button to display the category selection window and select a category in the window.

② **Camera selection tab**

Select a camera to be targeted for the preset list display.

If there are 5 or more cameras, click the ▼ button to display the camera selection window and select a camera in the window.

③ **Preset display update button**

When clicked, the preset list display is updated with any new preset data retrieved from the camera.

④ **Switchover button for number of presets displayed**

It switches the number of presets displayed in the preset list display part.

Select from either displaying 100 presets or 50 presets.

- **Preset list display part**

It displays a list of the camera presets. The background color of thumbnails for registered presets are displayed using the color set in the Preset Color settings of the camera.

- **Camera operation part**

This is the area to select the camera to be displayed.



① **Set button**

Clicking on any preset in the preset list display part with this in the ON position (red) will register the current camera position as the preset.

② **Rename button**

Clicking on any preset in the preset list display part with this in the ON position (red) will allow changing the name of the preset.

③ Del button

Clicking on any preset in the preset list display part with this in the ON position (red) will delete the preset data selected.

④ Rearrange button

Turning this ON (red) enters into a mode enabling rearranging the presets in the preset list display part.

Left clicking on any preset in this mode and dragging it to another preset will exchange the display position.

⑤ Reset button

It resets the current preset order that was rearranged using the Rearrange button and returns the presets to their initial order.

⑥ 2 step operation checkbox

It selects the preset call operation.

When the check is ON: After selecting a preset from the preset list display part, clicking the “⑦ Timed button” or the “⑧ Normal button” will call a preset.

When the check is OFF: Selecting a preset in the preset list display part will call a preset. The call speed for presets depends on the settings of the camera.

⑦ Timed slider/button

The time taken from calling the preset to camera movement completion can be specified.

Use the slider to specify the time through camera movement finishing. Clicking the Timed button will call a preset.

*This operation is only possible with the AW-UE150/AW-UE100 camera.

⑧ Normal button

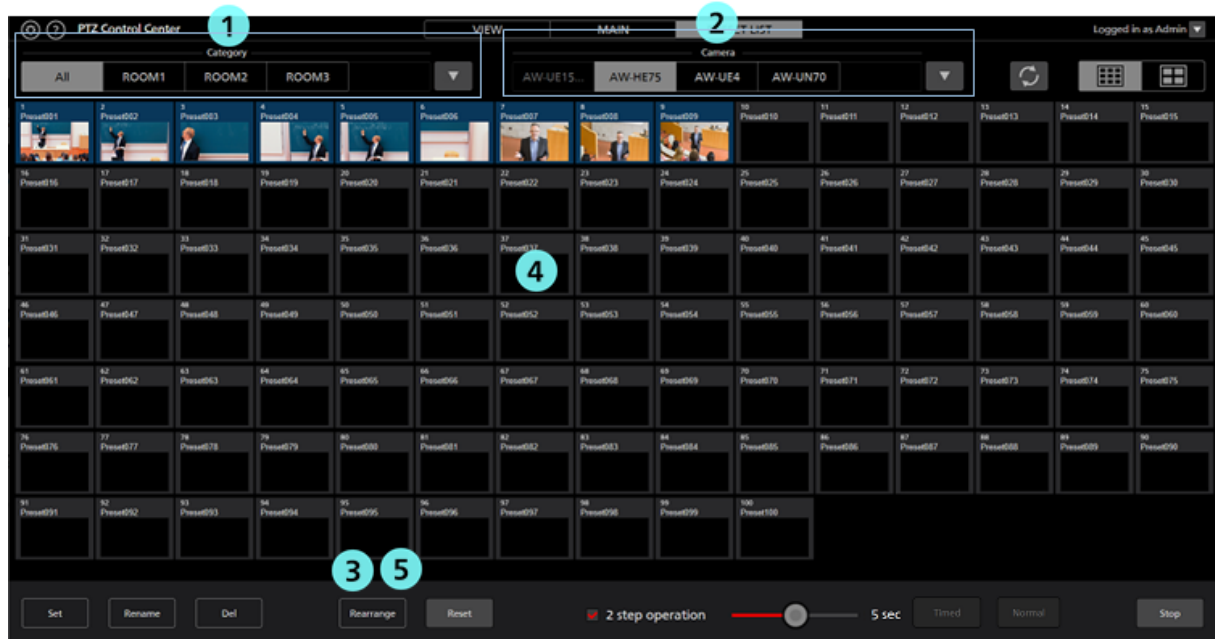
The preset will be called at the speed set in the camera.

⑨ Stop button

It stops the preset call operation.

Rearranging presets

You can use the procedures below to rearrange the presets in the preset list screen.



1. Select a category in the camera category selection tab.
2. Select a camera you wish to operate in the camera selection tab. The preset list of the camera is displayed on the preset list display part.
3. Click on the Rearrange button to turn it ON (red).
4. Clicking on a preset in the preset list display part and dragging it to another preset will exchange the each other's position.
5. Click on the Rearrange button to turn it OFF (black).

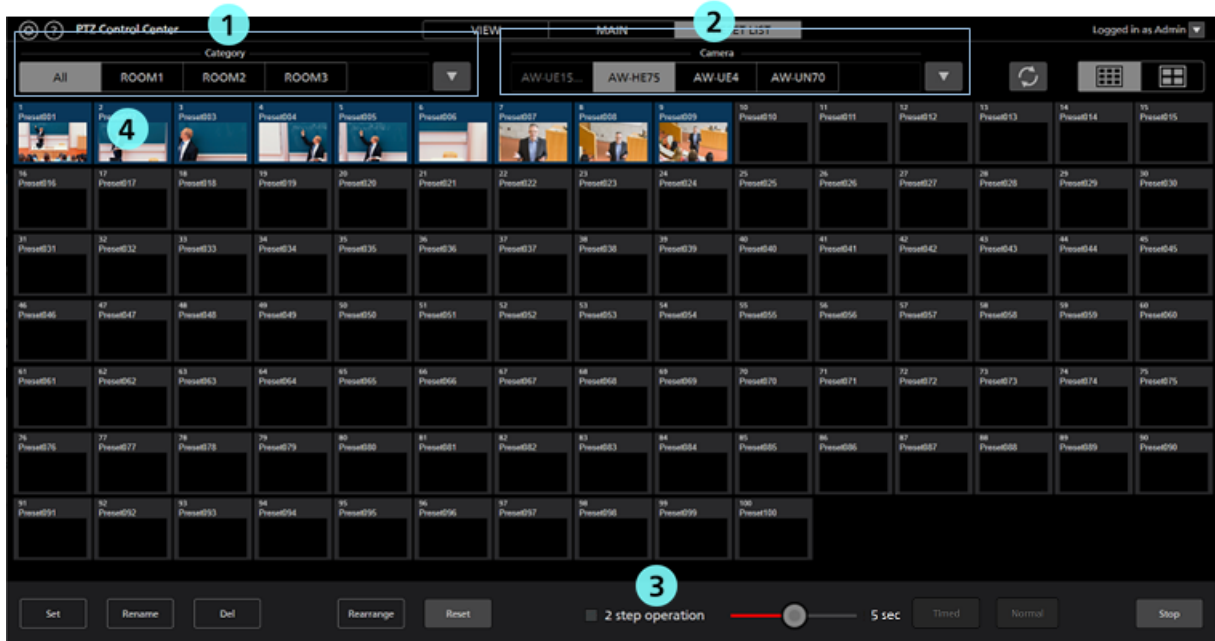
<Note>

- To return the rearranged order to the initial state, click on the Reset button to the right of the Rearrange button.
- When the selected camera is the camera to be controlled with KAIROS Cloud linkage, content of the sorted presets will not be saved.

Calling presets

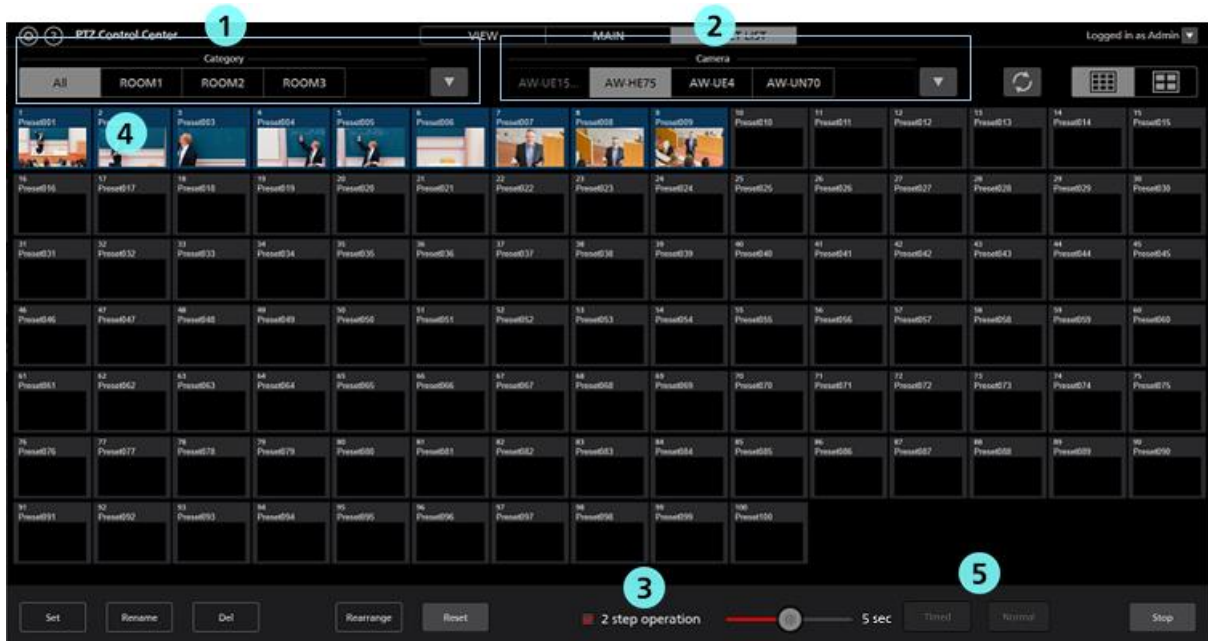
Use the procedures below to call a preset.

- When calling a preset immediately after selection



1. Select a category in the camera category selection tab.
2. Select a camera you wish to operate in the camera selection tab. The preset list of the camera is displayed on the preset list display part.
3. Set the “2 step operation” checkbox to OFF.
4. Clicking on any preset in the preset list display part will immediately call the preset. The call speed for presets depends on the settings of the camera.

- When calling a preset with a 2-step operation of preset selection → button operation



1. Select a category in the camera category selection tab.

2. Select a camera you wish to operate in the camera selection tab. The preset list of the camera is displayed on the preset list display part.
3. Set the “2 step operation” checkbox to ON.
4. Click on any preset in the preset list display part to select it.
5. Call the preset with one of the operations below.
 - Click on the Normal button
The preset will be called at the speed set in the camera.
 - Click on the Timed button after setting the time with the Timed slider
The preset is called to complete camera movement in the time set by the slider. This is only valid with the AW-UE150/AW-UE100 camera.

<Note>

- Clicking on the Stop button during a preset call will stop the call.

KAIROS Cloud linkage function

Cameras at a remote location can be operated like a camera on a local network by linking to the KAIROS Cloud Platform.

<Note>

- For details on the KAIROS Cloud Platform, refer to the Operations Manual of the KAIROS Cloud Platform.
- To use the linkage function of the KAIROS Cloud Platform, PC must be connected to the Internet.

2. Connect the camera to the KAIROS Cloud Platform.
For camera connection procedures, refer to the KAIROS Cloud Service Implementation Guide and Operations Manual of each application.
For cameras that can be operated, refer to "Cameras that can be operated" in this chapter.
3. Connect the software to the KAIROS Cloud Platform and operate the camera
For operation procedures, refer to "Operating the camera using linkage function" in this chapter.

Cameras that can be operated

- Cameras connected to the KAIROS Cloud Platform with Device routing function of the camera
- Cameras connected to the KAIROS Cloud Platform via Camera Gateway application

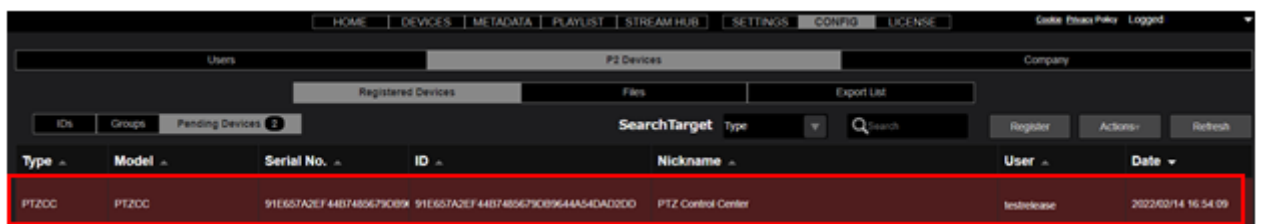
If the message window is not displayed and an error message is displayed in the Status field, check the status of connection to the Internet and that the login information of the KAIROS Cloud Platform is correct.



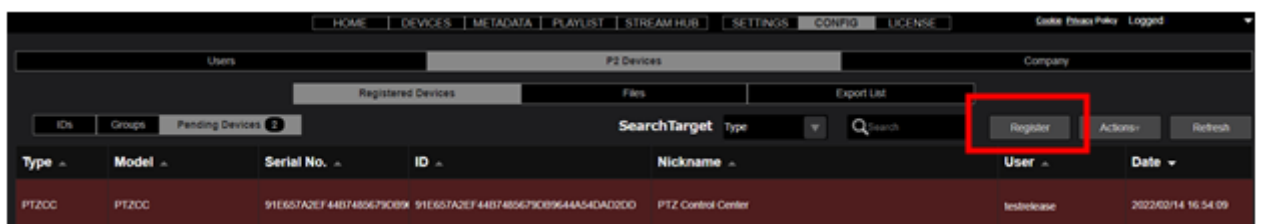

- When Connect automatically is checked, connection to the KAIROS Cloud Platform will automatically be made when logging in to the software.
- Information of cameras connected to the KAIROS Cloud Platform will not be automatically updated. To update the information of the cameras, click the Refresh button at the Device List field in the Cloud screen.
- For the following operations, cameras connected to the KAIROS Cloud Platform behaves differently than the cameras on the local network.

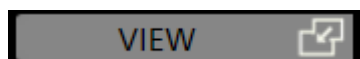

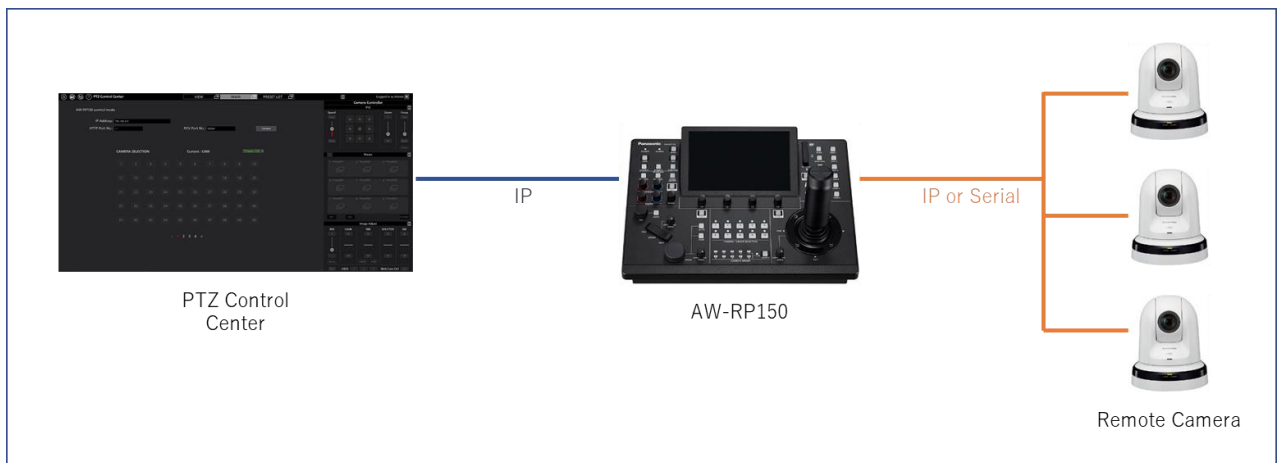

- The firmware of AW-RP150 is Ver.2.20-00-0.00 or higher.
- The remote camera must be controllable from the AW-RP150.

This function controls the remote camera via the AW-RP150. The operation target is not the remote camera registered in this software, but the remote camera registered in AW-RP150.

Therefore, the remote camera can be operated from this software even in an environment where the remote camera cannot be seen from this software (for example, when the AW-RP150 and the remote camera are connected with serial interface).

Setup for each device

Setup each device using the steps below.

• Camera setup

Set the camera SDI output format to be within the support scope of the SDI router and the SDI to UVC converter.
If there are multiple cameras, it is recommended to set the camera output formats to be the same to the extent possible.

• SDI to UVC converter setup

Set the SDI input settings and output settings as needed.

Set the SDI output settings (USB VIDEO Class image settings to be input to the PC) as follows.

Image Resolution: One of the following: 1920 x 1080 / 1280 x 720 / 640 x 360

Frame Rate: One of the following: 25 fps / 30 fps / 50 fps / 60 fps

• AJA SDI Router setup

Set the following in the AJA SDI Router.

- Set the [IP Address Type] to a [Static IP] and assign an IP address
- Set the [User Authentication] setting to [Disable]

Each device connection

Connect each device as follows.

When using SDI Router

- Network connection for each device

Connect the PC, camera, and SDI Router on the same network.

- Connection between the camera and the SDI Router

Connect the SDI output of the camera to one of the SDI inputs of the SDI Router.

- Connecting the SDI Router and SDI to UVC converter

Connect the SDI output Ch. 1 of the SDI Router to the SDI input of the SDI to UVC converter.

*No other SDI output than Ch. 1 is supported.

- PC and SDI to UVC converter setup

Connect the PC and the SDI to UVC converter with a USB cable.

When not using SDI Router

- Network connection for each device

Connect the PC and camera on the same network.

- Connection between the camera and the SDI to UVC converter

Connect the SDI output of the camera to SDI input of the SDI to UVC converter.

- PC and SDI to UVC converter setup

Connect the PC and the SDI to UVC converter with a USB cable.

Software setup

Set up the following in the software.

1. Open the Settings - System screen.
2. Set up the Image Capture Device item as follows.

SDI Router Address: When using SDI Router, enter the IP address of the SDI Router.

When not using SDI Router, leave blank.

USB Video Device: As the USB Video Class devices connected to the PC are displayed as a list, select the SDI to UVC converter device.

Resolution: Set the resolution to that of the USB Video Class image input from the SDI to UVC converter to the PC.

Frame Rate: Set the frame rate to that of the USB Video Class image input from the SDI to UVC converter to the PC.

3. Open the Settings - Camera screen.

4. Setup each camera you want to output SDI using the following procedure.

- 1) Click on the target camera in the Settings - Camera screen to select.
- 2) Click on the Edit button on the top right of the Settings - Camera screen and open the Edit Camera screen.
- 3) Select USB Video Device as the Image Capture Type.
- 4) (When using SDI Router) Set the SDI Channel No. of the Image Capture Type to the SDI input Ch. number of the SDI Router that is the SDI output destination of that camera.
- 5) Click on the OK button to exit the Edit Camera screen.

<Note>

- Leave the IP setting for the Image Capture Type item for cameras that do not output SDI.

Camera image display

After connecting and setting up each device, select the applicable camera on the MAIN screen of this software, and the image input from the SDI to UVC converter will be displayed in the PTZ camera image part.

Double-click the PTZ camera image section on the MAIN screen to display the image in full screen.

You can perform the following operations on the full-screen displayed image.

- Pan/Tilt the PTZ camera by clicking on the camera image

By clicking on the camera image, the PTZ camera performs Pan/Tilt operations so that the point you clicked is in the center of the screen.

- Pan/Tilt/Zoom the PTZ camera by specifying an area on the camera image

By clicking and dragging on the camera image, you can specify an area with a yellow box. When you stop dragging and fix the area, the PTZ camera performs Pan/Tilt/Zoom operations so that the specified area is displayed in a full screen.

- Zoom the PTZ camera by using the mouse wheel on the camera image

When the mouse cursor is on the camera image, you can zoom the PTZ camera by using the mouse wheel.

Check the following points if the image does not appear properly in the PTZ camera image part.

Problem: No image appears in the PTZ camera image part.

Action: Check that the SDI to UVC converter is properly identified by the PC, and that the SDI to UVC converter device is selected in the setting for Image Capture Device → USB Video

Problem: The image on the PTZ camera image part does not change even after changing the applicable camera on the MAIN screen.

Action: Check that the SDI Router is properly connected to the PC, and that the IP address of the SDI router is set correctly in the setting for Image Capture Device → SDI Router Address on the Settings - System screen.

Problem: Selecting an applicable camera on the MAIN screen displays an image from a different camera in the PTZ camera image part.

Action: Check that the SDI Router is properly connected to the PC, that the Image Capture Type settings are set to USB Video Device in the Settings - Camera screen, and that the Ch. number of the SDI Channel No. is the same as the SDI input Ch. number of the SDI Router which is the access point of the target camera.

Visual preset call feature

This feature makes it easy to call presets for multiple cameras at the same time.

You can assign presets for multiple cameras by placing the preset call icon anywhere on the screen.

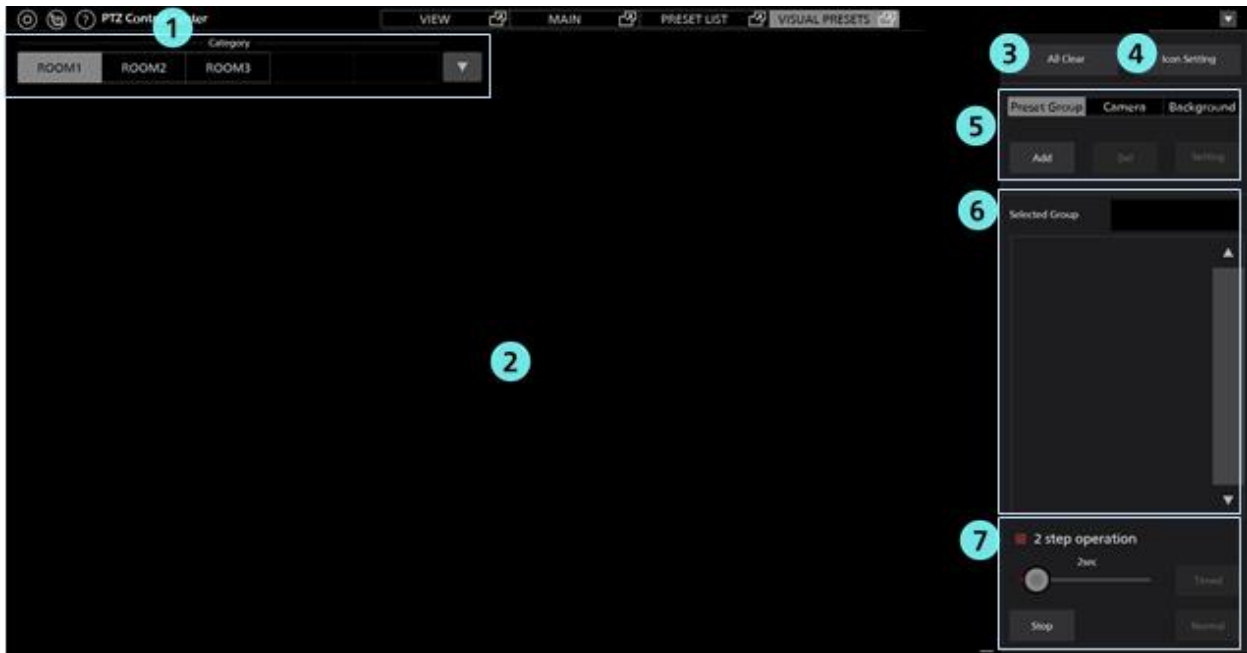
To give an example of operation, you can set the icon of each member on the screen that shows a parliamentary hall, then click the icon of the member you want to pay attention to so that all cameras point to that member.
